# Technical Appendix

### **Technical Appendix**

- The results of this opinion poll are based upon a representative sample of 926 eligible
   Irish voters aged 18 years +.
- As such, the results can be deemed to be accurate to within plus or minus 3.1 percentage points at the 95% confidence level.
- Fieldwork was conducted on an in-home, face-to-face basis over the period 3<sup>rd</sup> 13<sup>th</sup> April, 2016.
- The sample was stratified across all constituencies at 125 locations in the country with individuals selected for interview by way of Demographic Quotas (age, gender, socioeconomic status) in line with Central Statistics Office (CSO) and market research industry population estimates.



### **Technical Appendix**

- The subsequent survey results are weighted to reflect the known demographic profile of Irish adults, utilising the most recently published census population estimates from the Central Statistics Office (CSO).
- Party support levels are subsequently realigned in accordance with a technical adjustment factor, designed to smooth the effects of extreme highs and lows in support levels for individual parties as measured at a single point in time, and taking variable election day turnout levels into account.
- All aspects of the survey, including the Party Support adjustment factor, are implemented in accordance with the technical and ethical guidelines set down by the Association of Irish Market Research Organisations (AIMRO) and the European Society of Opinion & Market Research (ESOMAR).

### **Party Support Adjustment Factor: Technical Note**

- Predicting election results on the basis of poll data is not an exact science. All the
  evidence shows that support for individual parties can swing dramatically in the period
  between elections- very often outside the bounds of historic election results.
- What to do in these circumstances? Most polling companies in Britain and Ireland publish
  their raw survey results as an index of fluctuations in the emotional mood of voters. They
  also build in an adjustment based on a number of factors. Where we have reports of how
  people voted in the last general election as well as how they intend to vote in the next
  one we can use these data to model the likely level of swing from the last election
  results.
- We then add back in the forecasts of voters who have not voted last time or do not answer that particular question.
- Finally we take into account each individuals stated likelihood of voting in a forthcoming General Election.
- This is the basis of the adjusted voting forecast in Behaviour & Attitudes polls.




# Party Support Levels - Detailed Breakdown (excluding undecided/adjusted)







# Party Support Levels - Detailed Breakdown Trend (Excluding Undecided - Adjusted)









# Commentary

### **Background**

Today's is the first Sunday Times/Behaviour & Attitudes Poll since the General Election.

Our final pre-Election poll – which was conducted ten days out from polling day itself – had indicated an increase in support for Fianna Fáil and, even more notably, Micheál Martin as leader of that party.

There was clearly a sense of momentum behind the soldiers of destiny (if only due to the lacklustre nature of both the Fine Gael and Sinn Féin campaigns), and in the end, Fianna Fáil exceeded its pre-Election figure of 22% to garner 24% of the first preference vote come election day.

All of the pre-Election polls positioned Fine Gael at in or around 30% of the first preference vote, and there is no doubt that support for the leading coalition partner slid over the final ten days of the campaign, settling in at a disappointing 25% share of the vote for that party.

Our commentary for that last opinion poll pointed out what we believed to be the key weaknesses in Fine Gael's bewildering campaign communications strategy, and the party was ultimately punished for its perceived arrogance, and disconnect with the ordinary people.

Support for the Labour Party had dropped in our final pre-Election poll from 7% to 4%, with Joan Burton's satisfaction rating as Tánaiste also declining significantly over that period.



### **Background**

While the party eventually captured 6.6% of the first preference vote, its drop in core voter support rendered it transfer toxic - managing to capture just 4% of Dáil seats on almost 7% share of the first preference vote.

Our poll series had also flagged a continuous slide in support for Sinn Féin – from 21% in October last year down to just 15% in the days before polling day. And so to it came to pass, with the party capturing just 14% of the first preference vote.

Undoubtedly, that party's relatively poor performance, compared for example with its European election result just two years earlier, was down to its decision to position Gerry Adams as main party spokesperson throughout the campaign, thereby failing to leverage the more youthful and articulate generation of leaders such as Mary Lou McDonald and Pearse Doherty.

Finally, all of the pre-Election polls predicted the significant number of seats that would be won by 'smaller parties' and independent candidates, resulting as we now know, in a hung Dáil.

With regard to today's survey, it is the first time in over 20 years of opinion polling that I have conducted a poll when the country has been run by a caretaker administration.

To a certain extent, this scenario renders such questions as Government, Taoiseach and Tánaiste satisfaction ratings somewhat redundant!



### **Party Support and Leader Satisfaction Levels**

The poll results should nevertheless serve as a useful social document as to the mindset of the Irish electorate six weeks after a General Election which had thus far produced no signs of a stable Government of any type.

Not surprisingly given the caretaker status of the current administration, satisfaction with the manner in which the Government is running the country has plummeted from a pre election low of 33% to just 22% last week. The highest level of Government satisfaction is amongst the ABC1 white collar and professional working grouping (26%), although two-thirds of even this cohort is still dissatisfied with the status quo.

Support for Enda Kenny as caretaker Taoiseach and Joan Burton as caretaker Tánaiste has also slipped since just before the election, to 26% and 27% respectively.

Kenny's personal satisfaction stands at 66% amongst core Fine Gael voters, while Joan Burton's satisfaction score registers at just 59% of Labour Party supporters.

Gerry Adam's satisfaction rating remains at more or less the same low level it was at in advance of the Election (i.e. 33% in today's poll), although almost eight in ten of his own party's supporters indicate satisfaction with his role as leader.

Micheál Martin remains by far the most popular party leader however, with 42% of all voters satisfied with the way in which he is leading Fianna Fáil, rising to 85% of Fianna Fáil voters.

Based upon these numbers, it would appear that the only individual who has emerged unscathed from the last month and a half of semi-chaotic attempts to form a Government is indeed Micheál Martin, with signs of frustration towards Enda Kenny and presumably his Fine Gael negotiators in failing to bring negotiations to a head.



### **Party Support and Leader Satisfaction Levels**

With regard to party support, Fianna Fáil emerges in today's poll as the most popular party in the country – with 26% of the electorate indicating they would vote for that party if there was another election tomorrow. This positions Fianna Fáil a couple of percentage points higher than the vote it garnered in February's election, although the difference here is within the statistical margin of error.

Support for Fine Gael, meanwhile, has slid to 23% - which is in fact in or around where the party was over the summer of 2015, and a little lower than the 25.5% it achieved in the General Election.

Support for Sinn Féin, Labour and Independents/Others is very much on a par with the pre-Election poll completed on the 16<sup>th</sup> February last, although it seems likely that Labour would achieve somewhat more than the 4% level of support indicated in today's poll in the event of an actual election, particularly if a new leader is elected in the interim.



### **Fine Gael Party Leader Preferences**

When asked whether, in the event that the next Government is a minority one led by Fine Gael, they believed that Enda Kenny should remain as leader of Fine Gael to lead that Government as Taoiseach or not, just 22% of all Irish voters indicated a preference for Kenny remaining on as Taoiseach.

Opposition to Kenny continuing as Taoiseach is highest amongst those aged 55 years + (of whom 70% are opposed to him leading the next Government), C2DE working class individuals (71% opposition to Kenny), and amongst Fianna Fáil and Sinn Féin voters (where 81% in both instances oppose Kenny as Taoiseach).

In the event of Enda Kenny not remaining as leader of Fine Gael in a minority Fine Gael Government, 29% of all voters would prefer to see Leo Varadkar emerge as Taoiseach in such a new administration, followed by 15% who would opt for Simon Coveney, 12% for Frances Fitzgerald and 3% for Paschal Donohue.

6% indicated one of a number of alternative Fine Gael leaders, while just over a third of the electorate did not venture an opinion on the matter.

The notion of Leo Varadkar as Taoiseach is most appealing to those aged 35-54 years, ABC1 individuals, and indeed those living in rural areas.

Leo Varadkar still emerges as the most popular choice amongst Fine Gael supporters (at 40% support), although Simon Coveney settles in at 23% amongst core party voters – five percentage points higher than Frances Fitzgerald.


