Technical Appendix

Technical Appendix

- The results of this opinion poll are based upon a representative sample of 960 eligible Irish voters aged 18 years +.
- As such, the results can be deemed to be accurate to within plus or minus 3.2 percentage points at the 95% confidence level.
- Fieldwork was conducted over the period 9th 17th December, 2014 with interviewing carried out at the Behaviour & Attitudes Computer Aided Telephone Interviewing (CATI) Unit at Milltown House in Dublin.
- Interviewing was conducted across all 43 constituencies in the country with households selected for interview by way of Random Digit Dialling (RDD).
- The sample is split across RDD landline numbers and RDD mobile telephone numbers, so as to ensure that individuals living in landline only households, mobile only households, and households with both a landline and mobile telephone are represented in their correct proportions.



Technical Appendix

- The subsequent survey results are weighted to reflect the known demographic profile of Irish adults, utilising the most recently published census population estimates from the Central Statistics Office (CSO).
- Party support levels are subsequently realigned in accordance with a technical adjustment factor, designed to smooth the effects of extreme highs and lows in support levels for individual parties as measured at a single point in time, and taking variable election day turnout levels into account.
- All aspects of the survey, including the Party Support adjustment factor, are implemented in accordance with the technical and ethical guidelines set down by the Association of Irish Market Research Organisations (AIMRO) and the European Society of Opinion & Market Research (ESOMAR).

Party Support Adjustment Factor: Technical Note

- Predicting election results on the basis of poll data is not an exact science. All the evidence shows that support for individual parties can swing dramatically in the period between elections- very often outside the bounds of historic election results.
- What to do in these circumstances? Most polling companies in Britain and Ireland publish their raw survey results as an index of fluctuations in the emotional mood of voters. They also build in an adjustment based on a number of factors. Where we have reports of how people voted in the last general election as well as how they intend to vote in the next one we can use these data to model the likely level of swing from the last election results.
- We then add back in the forecasts of voters who have not voted last time or do not answer that particular question.
- Finally we take into account each individuals stated likelihood of voting in a forthcoming General Election.
- This is the basis of the adjusted voting forecast in Behaviour & Attitudes polls.







Commentary

Background

The last Sunday Times/Behaviour & Attitudes Opinion Poll was conducted in the immediate aftermath of the announcement of Budget 2015. At the time, the Government had endeavoured to sell the event as the first post-austerity budget in over six years, and evidence that our economic recovery was well underway.

The results of that Autumn Poll confirmed, however, that the public was not buying this analysis, and we saw Enda Kenny's satisfaction rating as Taoiseach drop to its lowest level in the entire Opinion Poll series.

In addition, the Poll generated much commentary around the fact that a quarter of all Irish voters were indicating that they would vote for an Independent candidate in the event of a General Election. The implications of the poll findings were clear – we were potentially facing into a post 2016 election scenario whereby there would be no obvious coalition option which could credibly form a Government.

Since that Poll, the situation has hardly improved for either Fine Gael or the Labour Party as Government partners.

Water charge protests have continued to rage across the country, culminating in a monster rally in Dublin just as fieldwork for this survey began.



Background

The economy may technically continue to recover and grow, but the headlines have focused on issues such as rising rents and unaffordable property prices.

Meanwhile, we are constantly reminded of failings in the management of state and statefunded bodies by way of coverage of Irish Water controversies, and the Prime Time documentary chronicling the abuse of disabled patients at a HSE funded nursing home.

All is by no means well in the eyes of the electorate and today's poll provides us with the opportunity to gauge the impact of this malaise on voter sentiment as we reach the end of 2014.



Party Support and Leader Satisfaction Levels

As discussed in the preceding section, our opinion poll series has been tracking support for Independents/Others at an average of 23% since the Spring of 2013.

Today's poll confirms this dynamic with 30% professing support for Independents and 'Other party' candidates at the next General Election.

If this level of support was replicated in an Election, there could be as many as 50 such TDs in the Dáil, from the hard left Austerity Alliance/Socialist Party TDs, to right of centre individuals such as Shane Ross.

On this latter point, it is interesting to note that support for Independents/Others actually peaks at 37% amongst the ABC1 white collar worker and professional status socio-economic grouping, and stands at just 25% of the skilled/unskilled working C2DEs.

In fact, Independents/Others are now the largest voting bloc amongst our middle class constituency, while Sinn Féin is attracting the support of more than one third of all working class voters.

With a view to understanding the mindset of those veering towards Independents, an additional question was included in this month's poll. All of those indicating support for Independents were asked whether they had a specific candidate in mind at this stage, or not. The rationale behind this question being that those who do have a particular Independent candidate in mind are more likely to actually vote for him/her in an election, as opposed to the remainder, who may be categorised as 'soft' Independent supporters.

The results of this question make interesting reading. A full 61% of those currently veering towards Independents/Others reveal that they do not in fact have a specific candidate in mind at this stage. To put it another way, 18% of all Irish voters are threatening to vote for an Independent next time out, yet have not at this stage identified precisely who that candidate might be.

It has to be assumed that an unknown proportion of these voters are still very much open to being persuaded to shift their vote back to one of the main political parties on voting day, depending on how convincing an argument those parties can put forward, as well as on the calibre of Independent candidate running in their constituency.

The counterbalance to this dynamic is the fact that there are already 12% of all Irish voters who have identified an Independent or smaller party candidate that they are likely to select on voting day.

Meanwhile, combined support for the Government parties has dropped to 29% - a decline of 5 points since October, and the first time this figure has dipped below 30% in the Poll series.

An analysis of each of the four end of year opinion polls conducted by B&A for the Sunday Times reveals a remarkably consistent combined Fine Gael/Labour figure, at 41% in December 2011, 42% in November 2012, and 41% in December, 2013.

These levels of support would have placed the two parties at least in contention to form a Government at the next election. Clearly, this vision is fast receding, and it now seems highly unlikely that this Government will be returned in its current format.

Indeed, the only credible means by which Fine Gael and Labour might return to Government based on today's figures would be by way of a grand coalition with Fianna Fáil, or via an alliance with an amalgam of Independents.

This general scenario would certainly suggest that there is room in Irish politics today for a more formal Independent candidate voting alliance, and/or a new centrist political party altogether.

At an individual party level, Fianna Fáil continues to languish at 18% - more or less the share of vote it received in the 2011 Election. The Soldiers of Destiny stand at just 15% in Dublin – significantly behind all other parties/groupings bar the Labour Party.

Support of Fine Gael has dipped insignificantly by one percentage point to 24% - matching its lowest ever Sunday Times/Behaviour & Attitudes rating reached in August of this year.

Meanwhile, Labour's vote has plummeted by four percentage points to just 5% support this month. Again, this is an all-time low for Labour in our polling series, dipping below the 7% registered in advance of last summer's European and Local Elections.

Labour support is strongest in Dublin, albeit at 8% the party still faces major losses come the 2015/2016 Election.

Meanwhile, Sinn Féin has withstood the onslaught from its opposition, with its support now standing at 22% - the highest ever achieved in a Sunday Times Poll. Support for Sinn Féin is fairly evenly spread between urban and rural areas, although a disproportionately large percentage of its support base stems from the younger age groups who are less likely to actually turn out to vote on the day.



Economic Outlook

In last year's end of year poll, our special Economic Outlook section confirmed that, while people expected the economy to either level off or improve during 2014, they believed it would be quite some time before the benefits of that recovery would reach themselves and their family.

As we know, this view has proven to be accurate, with the average household continuing to struggle on a day to day basis.

This year, it was decided to repeat precisely the same questions about the economy as were administered in 2013, so as to allow for an accurate gauge as to whether the underlying sentiment is towards a real economic uplift or not.

In line with a raft of consumer and business confidence surveys conducted by Behaviour & Attitudes over the course of the last 12 months, the indications today are most definitely that people are beginning to believe that their personal/household finances may finally be about to improve.

Thus, the proportion of all eligible Irish voters who expect their personal income to be higher in 2015 compared to 2014 has risen from 12% last year to 19% today. Similarly, the proportion who fear their personal income will be lower next year has dropped from 42% in December 2013 to 29% this December.



Economic Outlook

The omens also look good with regard to the extent to which people intend to inject their newly increased finances back into the economy.

Thus, the percentage of voters who expect to be purchasing less goods or services over the next 12 months has dropped from 31% last year to just 23% this year.

The type of goods or services that people suggest they will be spending their money on during 2015 include taking a holiday abroad (up to 50% of all adults from 53% last year), carrying out home improvements/extensions (from 24% to 25% year-on-year), buying a new/newer car (22% this year, 23% last year), and investing in home entertainment equipment (up a significant four percentage points from 17% last December to 21% this year).

All of these findings augur well for the economy during 2015. Unfortunately for Fine Gael and the Labour Party, it has not yet managed to link this increasing consumer sentiment with Government decisions and actions on the economy, in the mind of the general electorate.
