Technical Appendix

- The results of this opinion poll are based upon a representative sample of 909 eligible Irish voters aged 18 years +.
- As such, the results can be deemed to be accurate to within plus or minus 3.3 percentage points at the 95% confidence level.
- Fieldwork was conducted on an in-home, face-to-face basis over the period 1st – 13th July, 2016.
- The sample was stratified across all constituencies at 125 locations in the country with individuals selected for interview by way of Demographic Quotas (age, gender, socio-economic status) in line with Central Statistics Office (CSO) and market research industry population estimates.

Technical Appendix

- The subsequent survey results are weighted to reflect the known demographic profile of Irish adults, utilising the most recently published census population estimates from the Central Statistics Office (CSO).
- Party support levels are subsequently realigned in accordance with a technical adjustment factor, designed to smooth the effects of extreme highs and lows in support levels for individual parties as measured at a single point in time, and taking variable election day turnout levels into account.
- All aspects of the survey, including the Party Support adjustment factor, are implemented in accordance with the technical and ethical guidelines set down by the Association of Irish Market Research Organisations (AIMRO) and the European Society of Opinion & Market Research (ESOMAR).

Party Support Adjustment Factor: Technical Note

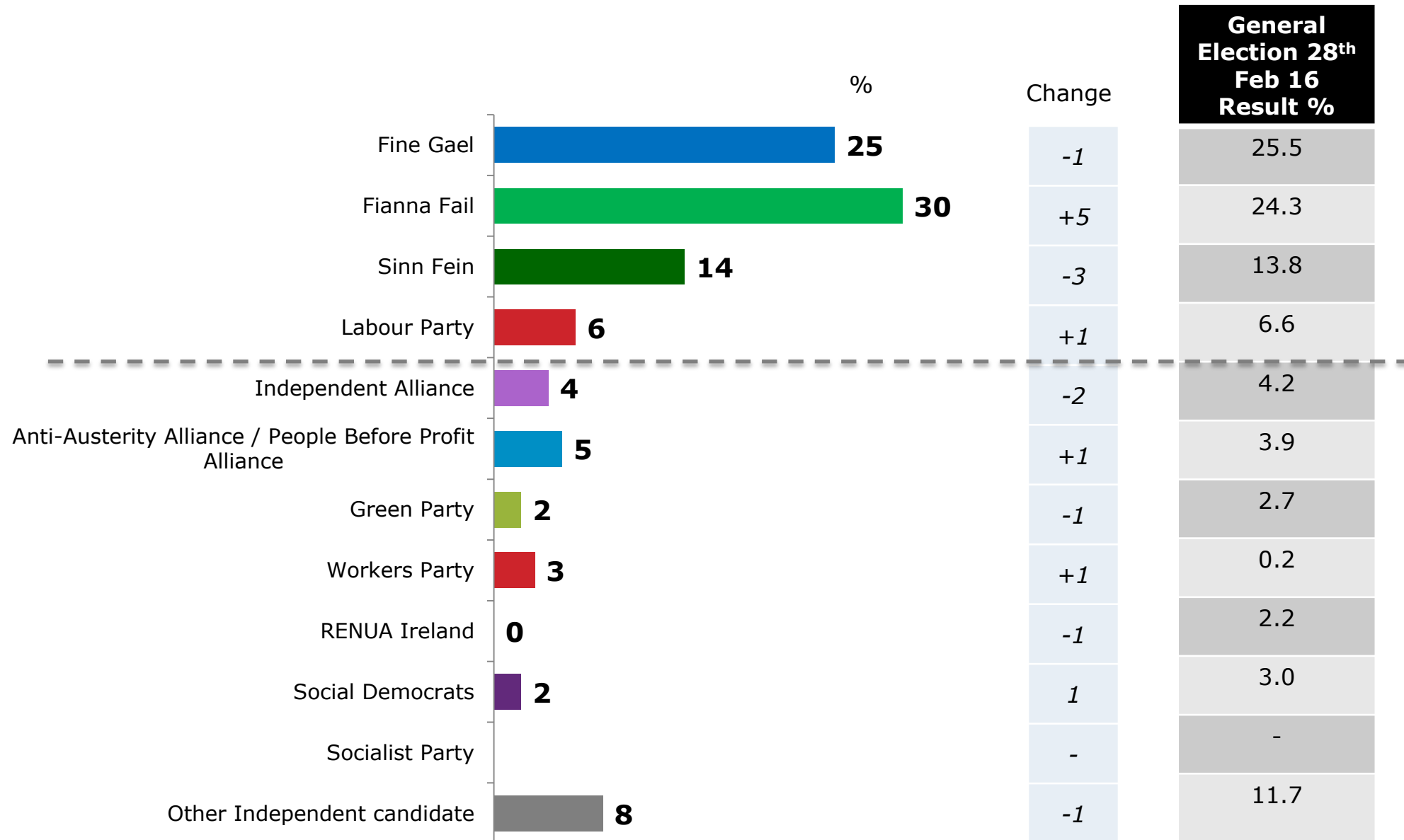
- Predicting election results on the basis of poll data is not an exact science. All the evidence shows that support for individual parties can swing dramatically in the period between elections- very often outside the bounds of historic election results.
- What to do in these circumstances? Most polling companies in Britain and Ireland publish their raw survey results as an index of fluctuations in the emotional mood of voters. They also build in an adjustment based on a number of factors. Where we have reports of how people voted in the last general election as well as how they intend to vote in the next one we can use these data to model the likely level of swing from the last election results.
- We then add back in the forecasts of voters who have not voted last time or do not answer that particular question.
- Finally we take into account each individuals stated likelihood of voting in a forthcoming General Election.
- This is the basis of the adjusted voting forecast in Behaviour & Attitudes polls.

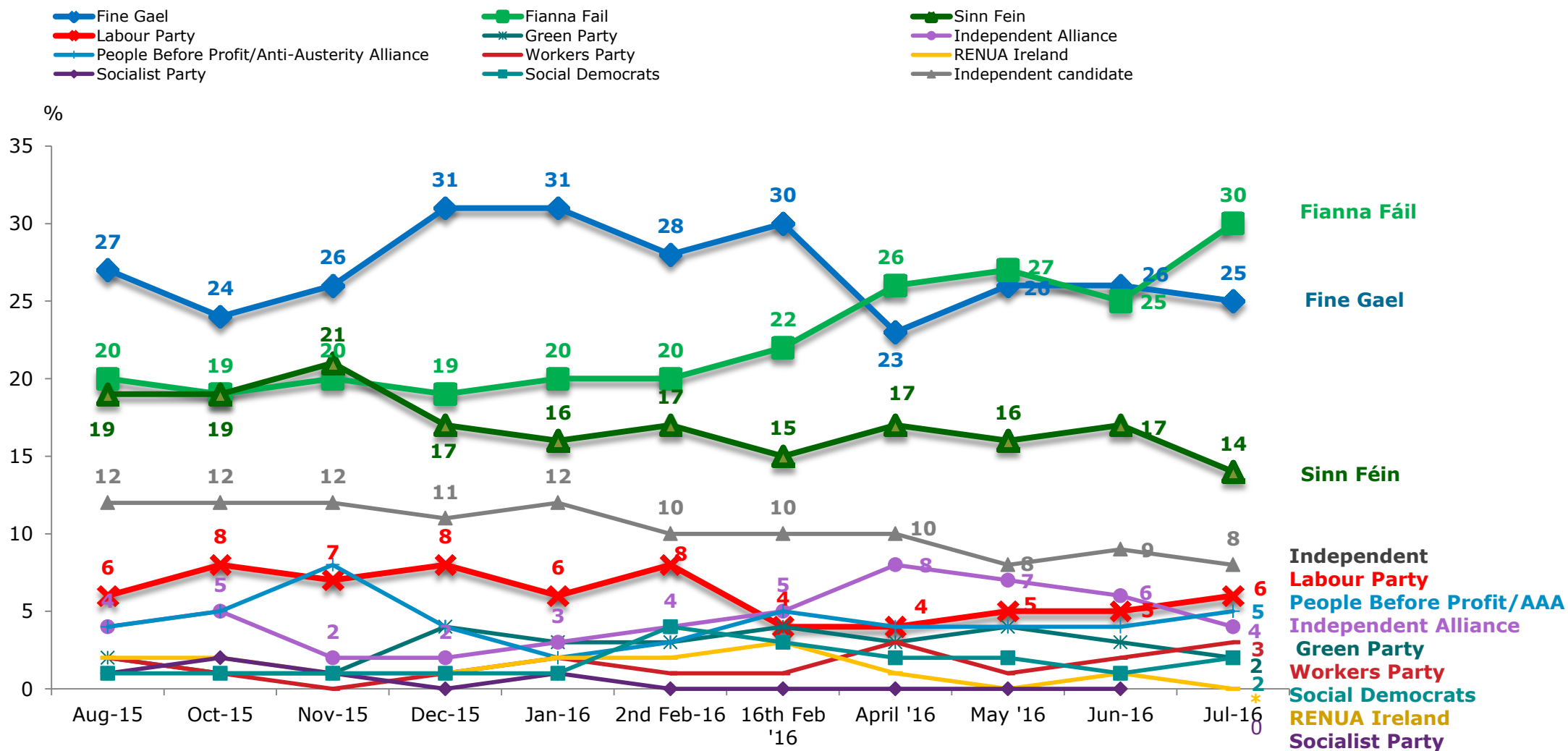

Party Support Levels – Detailed Breakdown (excluding undecided/adjusted)



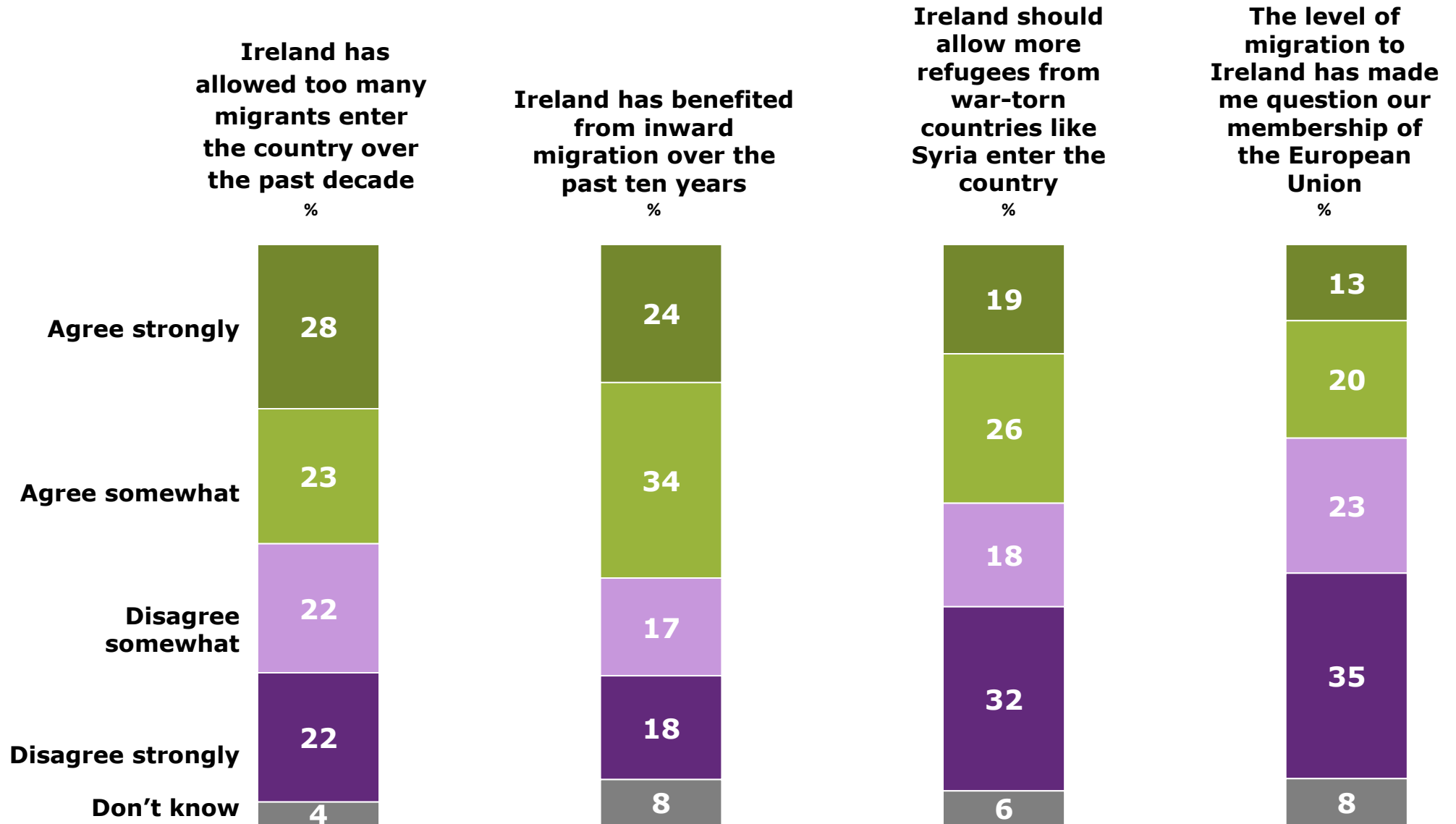

Commentary

Sunday Times/Behaviour & Attitudes Opinion Poll Series

Background

In last month's poll, barely a quarter of the electorate suggested they were happy with the way in which the Government is running the country, with approaching two-thirds actually dissatisfied. Support levels for the main parties had remained practically static between May and June, and we attributed all of the above to a general sense of torpor having descended upon the political landscape since the inconclusive outcome of the General Election.

It is fair to say that any such sense of torpor was well and truly dissipated during the fieldwork period for today's poll, which ran over the ten day period up to last Wednesday, 13th July.

Specifically, following a series of mishaps culminating in the re-appointment of James Reilly as Deputy Party Leader, Taoiseach Enda Kenny found himself under severe internal party pressure to at least set out a timeline for his departure as leader of Fine Gael.

At the time of writing, Kenny appeared to have steadied the ship in this regard, with none of the Fine Gael leaders in waiting willing to draw first blood.

Nevertheless, the recent couple of weeks has been an unsettling one for the main Government Party, with much speculation of a resurgent Fianna Fáil choreographing an excuse to precipitate a General Election as early as this Autumn.

Meanwhile, in both the US and Post Brexit UK, unprecedented political instability threatens Ireland's own economic recovery. Against this backdrop, the need for stable and reliable Government over the next couple of years is particularly acute, while looking increasingly unlikely.

Party Support and Leader Satisfaction Levels

One of the effects of the more dynamic political environment of late seems to have been a modest uplift in satisfaction for both the Government and all of the main party leaders across the board.

This lift in satisfaction with our key political protagonists may have more to do with increased levels of engagement with the political process over the last few weeks, than it does with the performance of our leaders in that process per se.

Nevertheless, it is worth noting that the most pronounced improvements in Government satisfaction have been amongst those aged 18 to 34 years, and white collar working ABC1 urban dwellers. In other words, there are some signs that our young, urban, cosmopolitans are beginning to see some signs of improvement in their lot, albeit very tentatively at this stage.

Despite recent rumblings about his leadership of the Fine Gael party, Enda Kenny's personal satisfaction rating has increased four points to 31% today. This brings the Taoiseach back to the levels of support he enjoyed in January and February of this year before the General Election, although still a long way off his all-time high of 47% after he was first elected Taoiseach in 2011.

Satisfaction with Kenny stands at 75% of all Fine Gael supporters (up 7 points since last month) – suggesting that the Fine Gael grassroots agree with its parliamentary party that the Taoiseach need not resign his position just yet.

Meanwhile Micheál Martin remains by far the most popular political leader in the country, with his satisfaction score rising by a remarkable nine percentage points amongst 18-34 year olds, and 7 points within the ABC1 socio economic cohort.

For the first time since last April, party support levels have changed significantly.

Most notably, today's poll sees Fianna Fáil support increase five percentage points in just four weeks, to 30%. This is in fact the highest figure ever recorded for Fianna Fáil in the Behaviour & Attitudes/Sunday Times Polling series established before the 2011 General Election. Its poll figures now position Fianna Fáil as the most popular party in the country and, if there was a General Election tomorrow, the party most likely to lead the subsequent Government.

Support for Fianna Fáil has increased in all of the key socio-demographic groupings across the country, suggesting that we are beginning to witness a meaningful recovery in the party's fortunes, as opposed to a more temporary 'spike'.

Cohorts which have generated the greatest increases in Fianna Fáil support include females (from 24% in June to 33% in July), 18-34 year olds (up 8 points to 21%), and those living in both Dublin (up 10 points to 25%) and Connaught/Ulster (from 23% to 31%).

Fine Gael will at least be relieved that Fianna Fáil support has been at the expense of Sinn Féin, Independents and smaller parties, and not themselves.

In fact, at 25% in this month's poll, Fine Gael support is more or less identical to the share of support it garnered in February's election. Support for the party is evenly spread across gender and age groups, and peaks as is normal for that party amongst rural voters, white collar/professional workers, and those from a farming background.

Sinn Féin support has dropped three percentage points month-on-month and it has now settled back to the 14% share of support it achieved in the General Election. The party has lost most ground amongst males, younger 18-34 year olds, and C2DE 'working class' voters. Most remarkably of all, however, is the 9 percentage point drop in Sinn Féin's support amongst the rural electorate – down from 18% in rural areas last month to just 9% now.

Finally, support for Independents and smaller parties is down a statistically insignificant two percentage points to 22%, with the greatest single loser within this bloc being the Independent Alliance which has slipped marginally from 6% in June to 4% today.

All in all, the message from today's poll is clear. Fianna Fáil's strategy of sitting out the next 12 to 18 months on the sidelines before precipitating a General Election is already bearing fruit. There is still a long way to go before Fianna Fáil is likely to pull the plug, however, by sheer virtue of the fact that on 30% of the vote, the party would be left scrambling to form just as unstable an administration as the one Fine Gael managed to cobble together just five months ago.

Ireland & Migration

Voters' views towards immigration proved instrumental in the UK's decision to vote for Brexit, and have at least in part accounted for the success of Donald Trump in capturing the Republican Party Presidential nomination in the US.

Against this global backdrop, a series of questions related to the issue was included in today's poll. The pattern of response to the four statements concerning Ireland and migration display just how complex an issue it is, and how nuanced people's views and opinions are in relation to it.

For example, a small majority (51%) of Irish voters agree that Ireland has allowed too many migrants enter the country over the past decade, while at the same time 58% agree that the country has benefitted from inward migration over the same period.

A closer analysis of the data confirms that there are in fact some people (c. 20% of the total population) who feel that Ireland has benefitted from migration over the past 10 years, but also feel that too many migrants have been allowed enter the country in the same period.

The implication would appear to be that there are some people who feel that while the country has benefitted from the economic contribution of a certain number (or type?) of immigrants over the last decade, we have simply allowed too many of them enter the country on a sustainable basis.

Ireland & Migration

Perhaps surprisingly, the most hardened views on immigration relate to whether Ireland should accept more refugees from war-torn countries like Syria. At this question, a full one-third of the population disagrees strongly that we should accept such migrants, with just 19% agreeing strongly.

Generally speaking, the most benign views towards immigrants are expressed by young, urban, well educated males. Those significantly less well disposed towards inward migration are more likely to be older (55 years+), C2DE working class individuals.

From a party political perspective, supporters of Fine Gael and the Labour Party are more likely to acknowledge the benefits of migration to Ireland over the years, and indeed to suggest that we should allow more refugees from war torn countries like Syria enter the country. Conversely, supporters of Sinn Féin and, to a lesser extent, Fianna Fáil, are more likely to agree that Ireland has allowed too many migrants enter the country over the last ten years.

Interestingly, just one-third of the Irish electorate agrees that the level of migration to Ireland has made them question our membership of the European Union, suggesting that if there was a referendum on Ireland's membership of the EU immigration may be less of an issue in deciding the outcome than it was in the UK.
