Technical Appendix

Sample Size

The results of this opinion poll are based upon a representative sample of 928 eligible Irish voters aged 18 years +.



Fieldwork

As such, the results can be deemed to be accurate to within plus or minus 3.3 percentage points at the 95% confidence level. Fieldwork was conducted on an in-home, face-to-face basis over the period 5th – 17th April, 2018.



Location

The sample was stratified across all constituencies at 125 locations in the country with individuals selected for interview by way of Demographic Quotas (age, gender, socio-economic status) in line with Central Statistics Office (CSO) and market research industry population estimates.



Technical Appendix

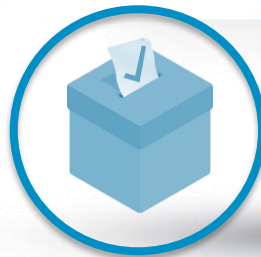
Weighting

The subsequent survey results are weighted to reflect the known demographic profile of Irish adults, utilising the most recently published census population estimates from the Central Statistics Office (CSO).



Party Support

Party support levels are subsequently realigned in accordance with a technical adjustment factor, designed to smooth the effects of extreme highs and lows in support levels for individual parties as measured at a single point in time, and taking variable election day turnout levels into account.



Guidelines

All aspects of the survey, including the Party Support adjustment factor, are implemented in accordance with the technical and ethical guidelines set down by the Association of Irish Market Research Organisations (AIMRO) and the European Society of Opinion & Market Research (ESOMAR).

Party Support Adjustment Factor: Technical Note

- Predicting election results on the basis of poll data is not an exact science. All the evidence shows that support for individual parties can swing dramatically in the period between elections- very often outside the bounds of historic election results.
- What to do in these circumstances? Most polling companies in Britain and Ireland publish their raw survey results as an index of fluctuations in the emotional mood of voters. They also build in an adjustment based on a number of factors. Where we have reports of how people voted in the last general election as well as how they intend to vote in the next one we can use these data to model the likely level of swing from the last election results.
- We then add back in the forecasts of voters who have not voted last time or do not answer that particular question.
- Finally we take into account each individuals stated likelihood of voting in a forthcoming General Election.
- This is the basis of the adjusted voting forecast in Behaviour & Attitudes polls.

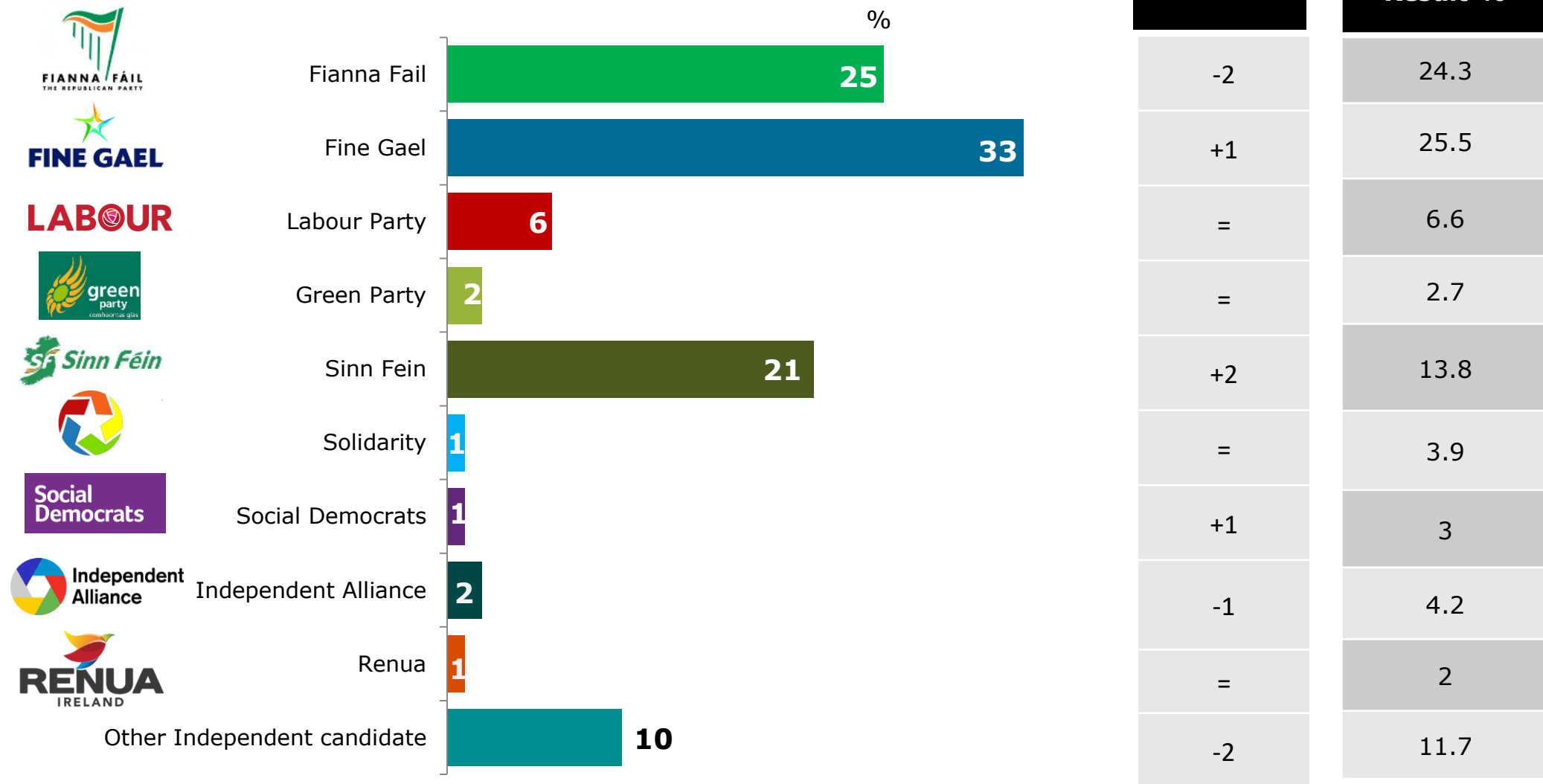

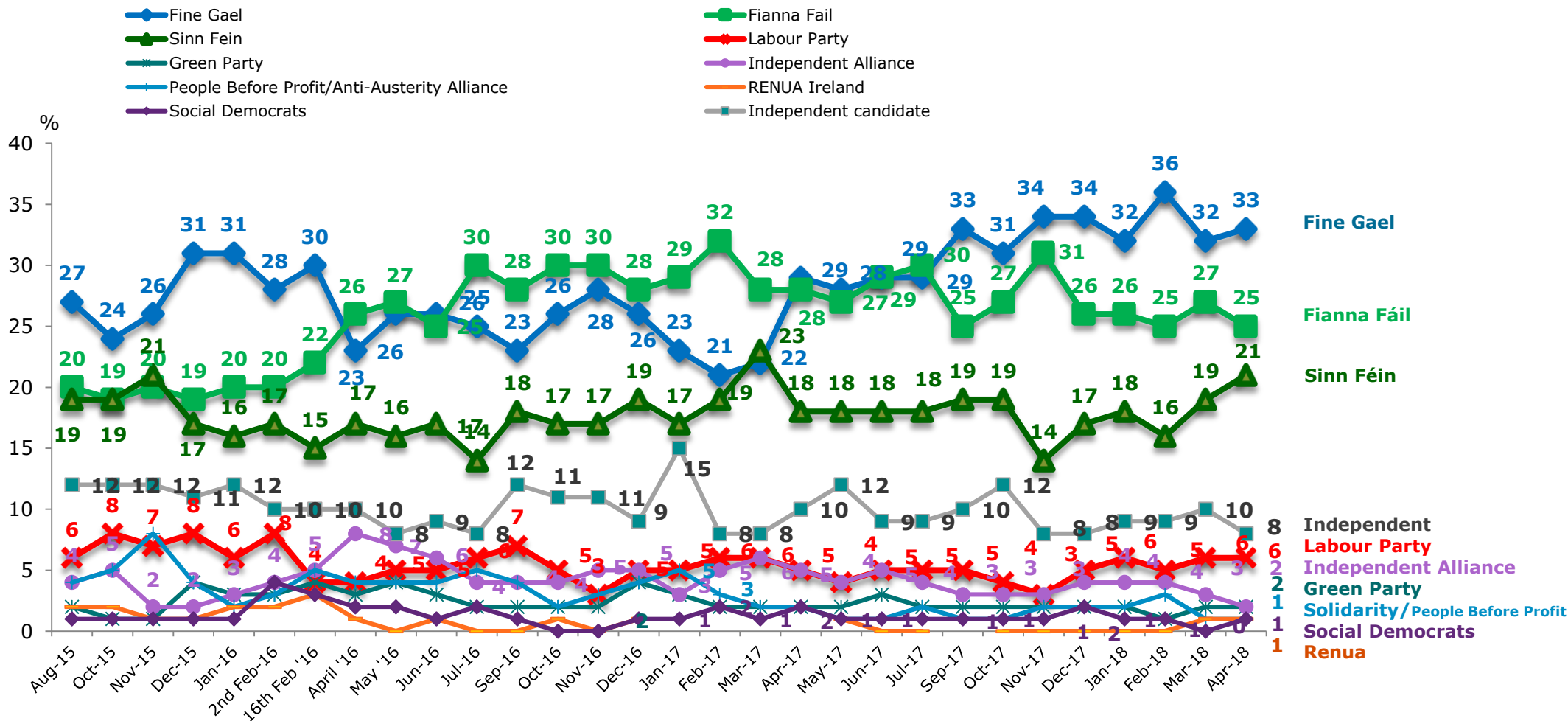

Party Support Levels – Detailed Breakdown (excluding undecided/adjusted)



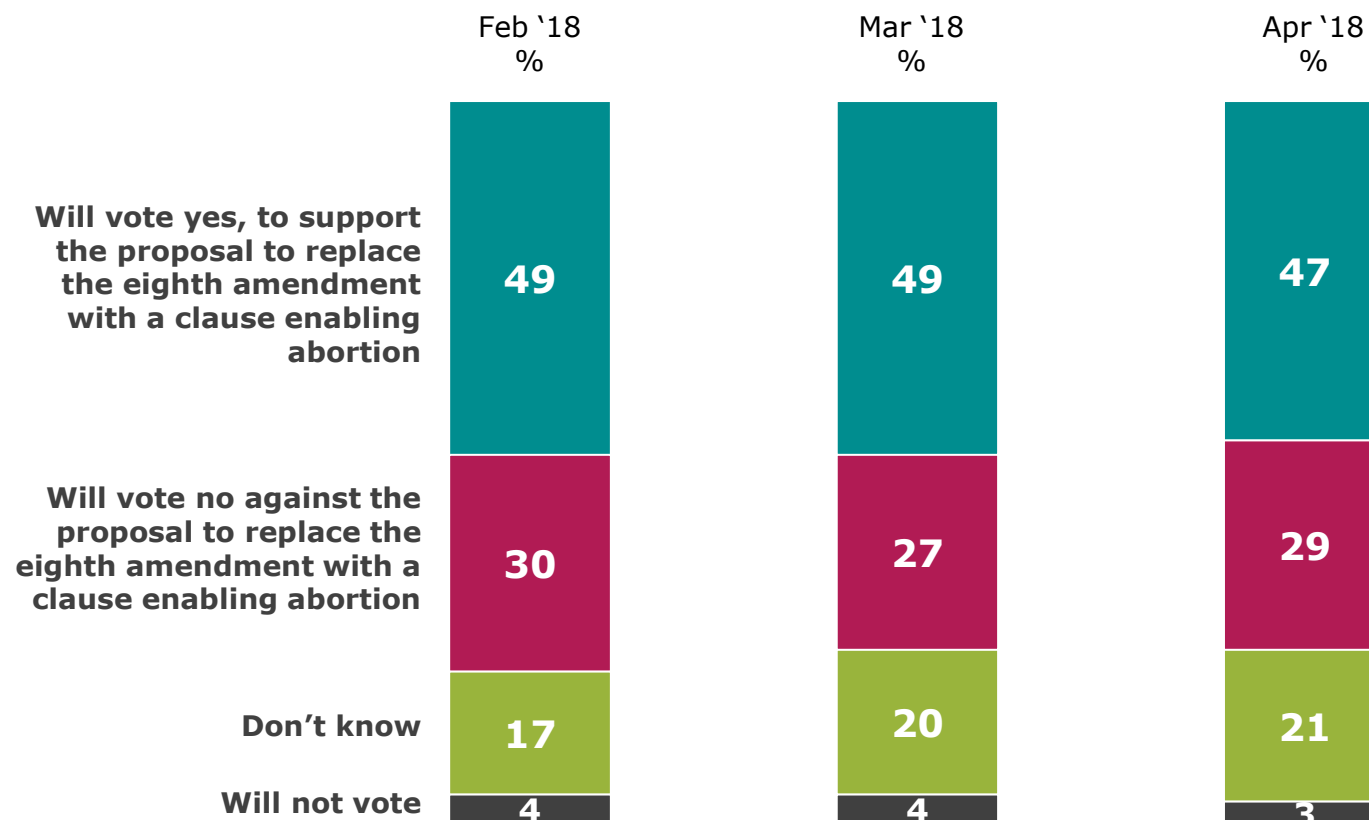
Party Support Levels – Detailed Breakdown Trend (Excluding Undecided – Adjusted)

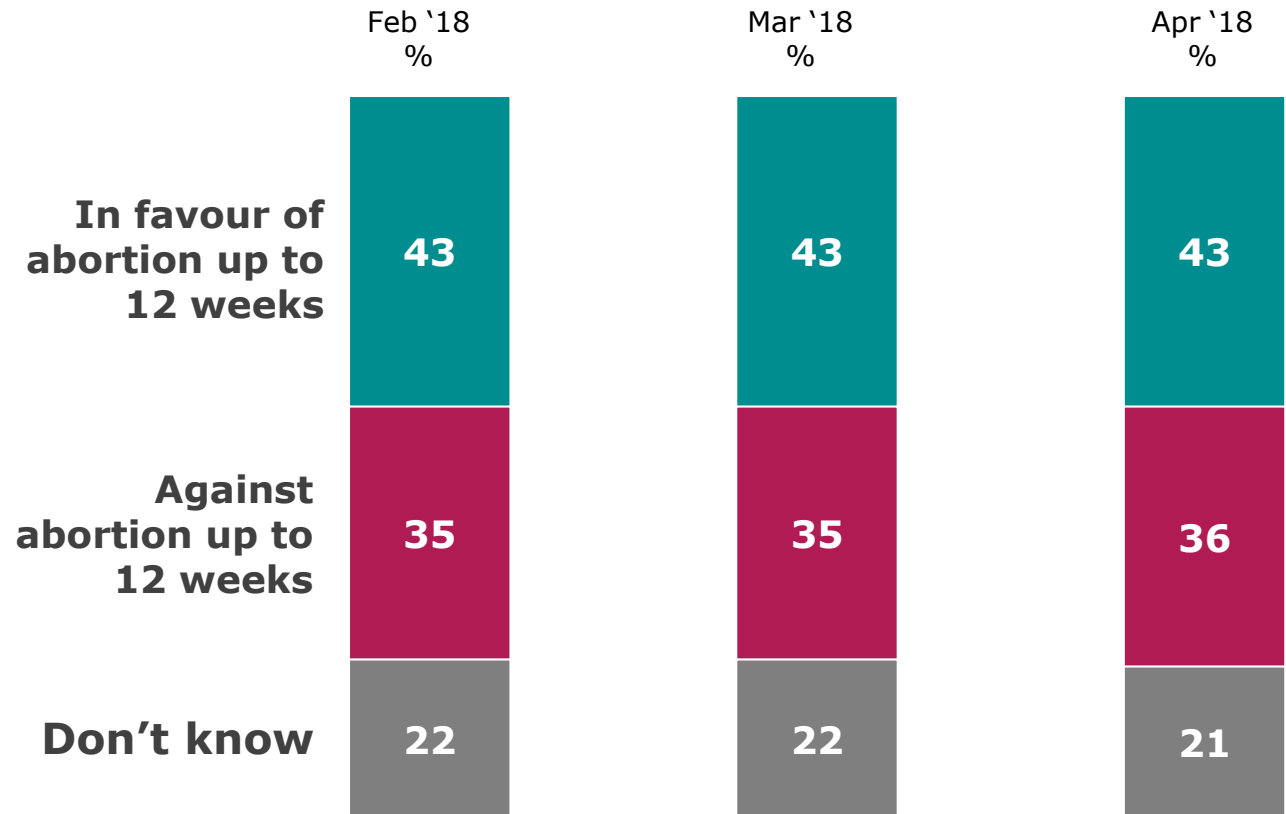

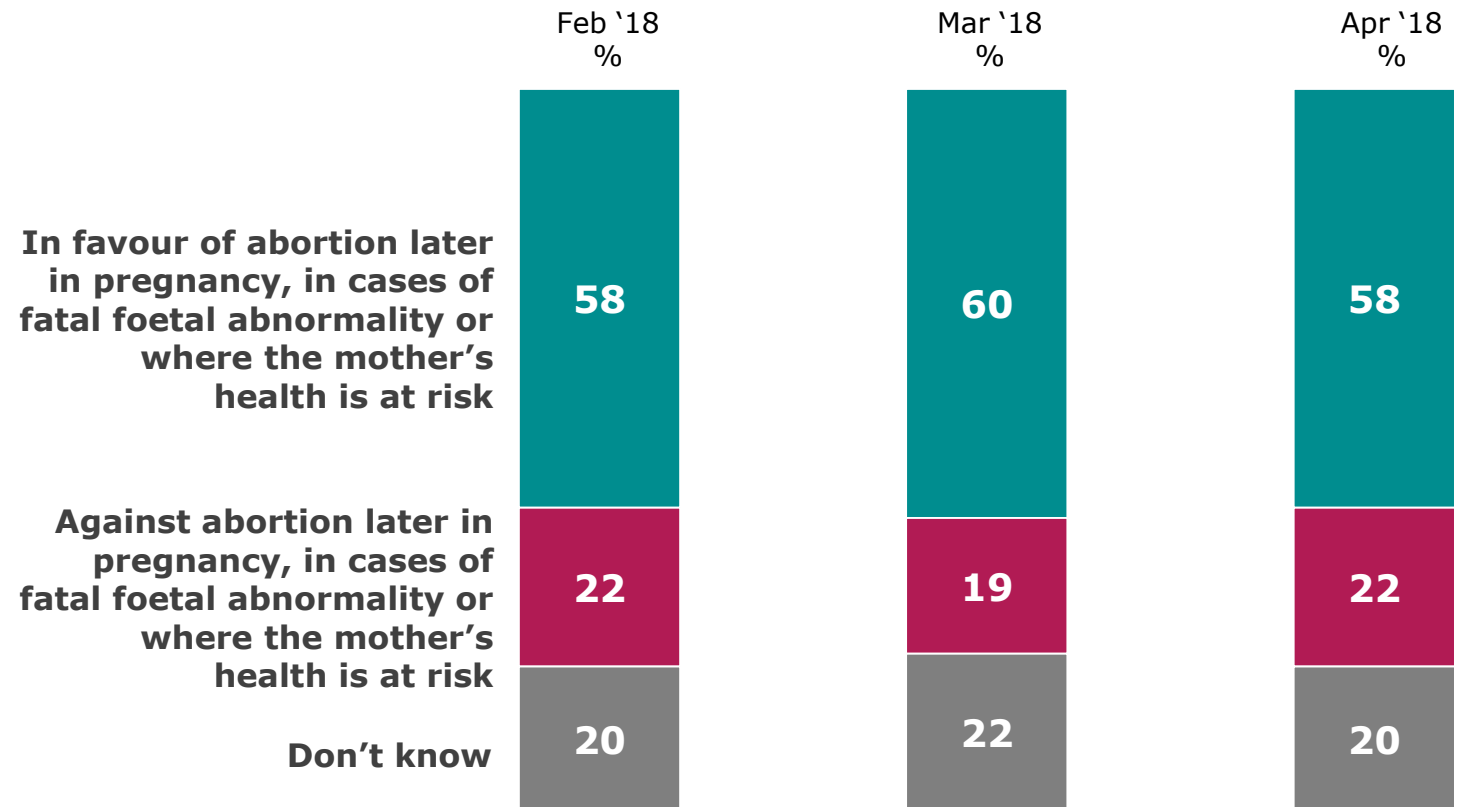
And if the eighth amendment is repealed, would you be in favour of or against legislation to allow abortion without restriction up to 12 weeks of pregnancy?

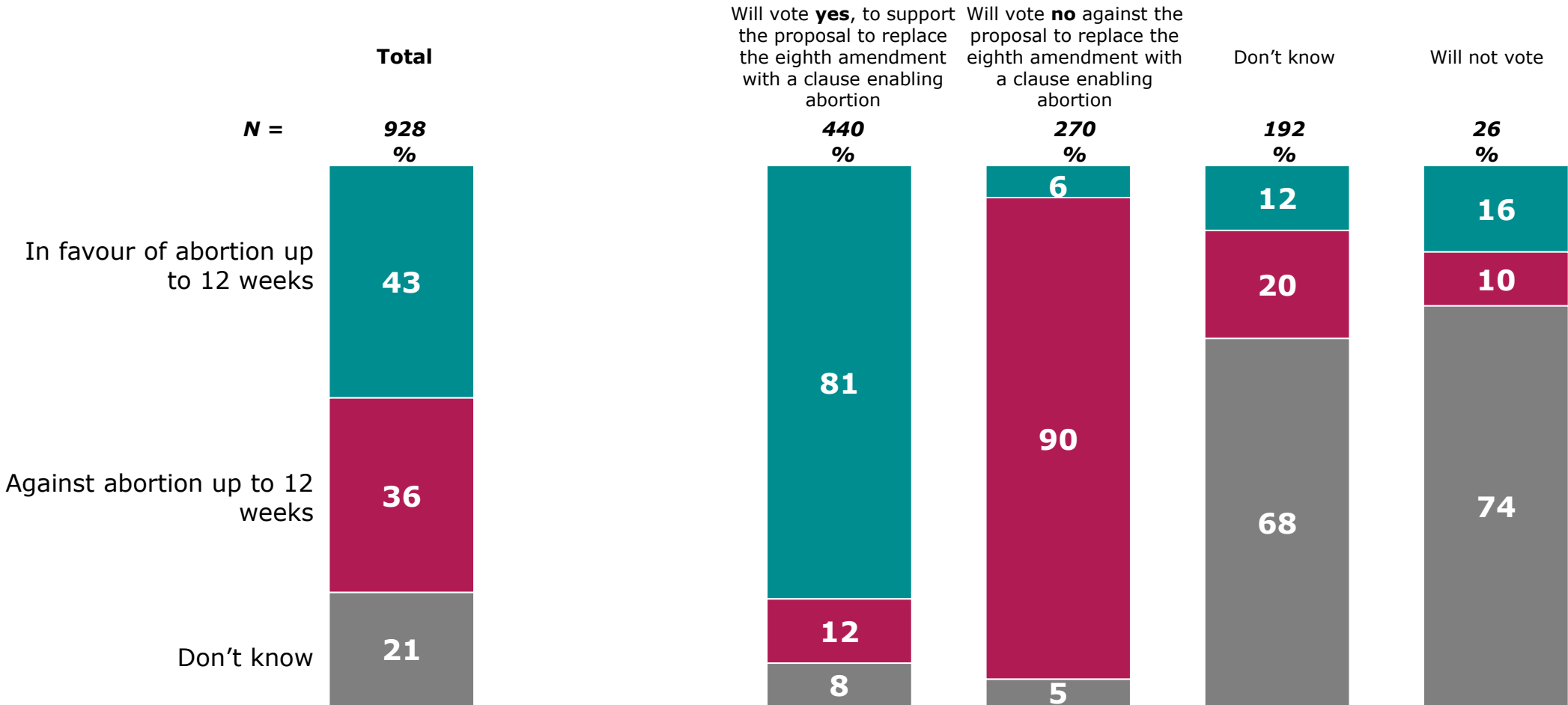


Attitudes towards legislation to allow abortion without restriction up to 12 weeks of pregnancy x Referendum

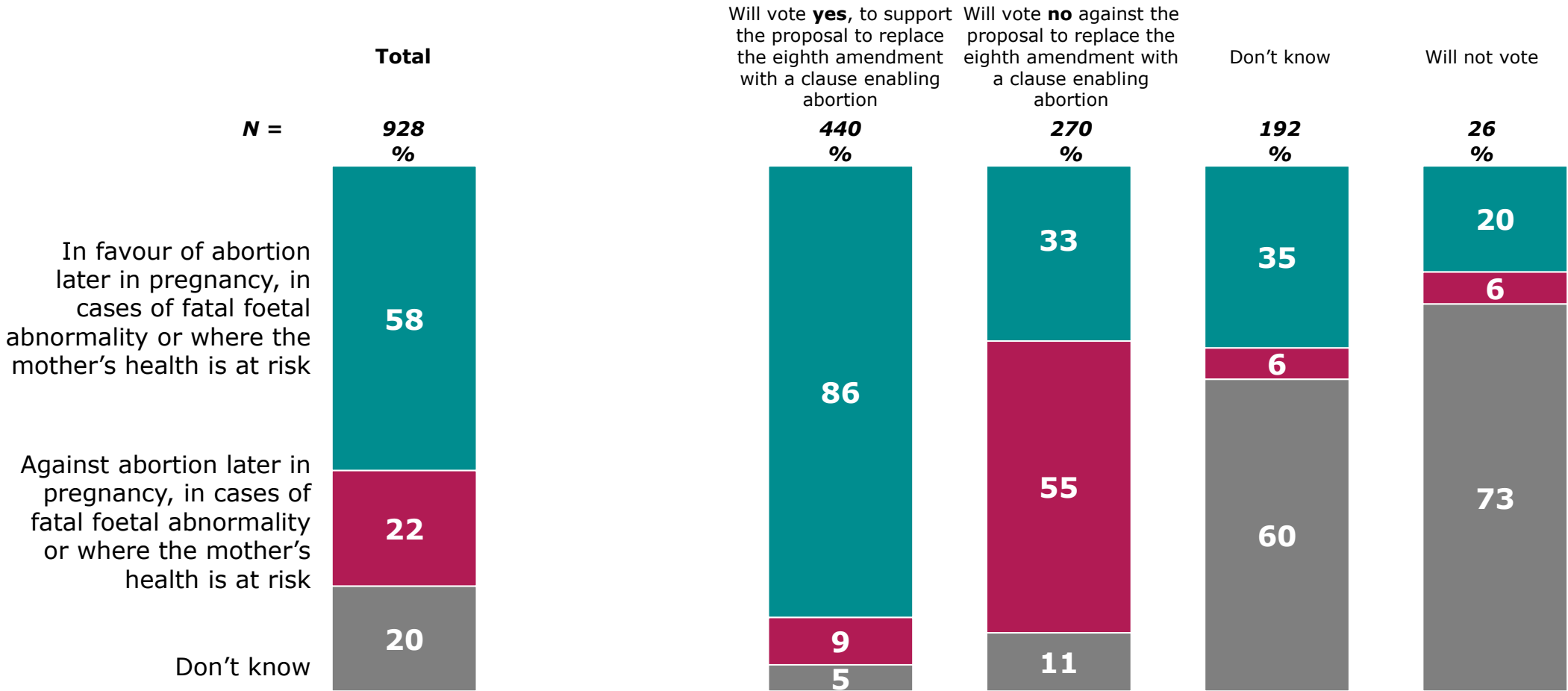

Commentary

Sunday Times/Behaviour & Attitudes Opinion Poll Series

Background

Fieldwork for today's Behaviour & Attitudes/Sunday Times Poll was conducted over the period Thursday, 5th – Tuesday, 17th April, 2018.

As such, fieldwork coincided with the Dáil Easter recess, with the average voter more interested in school and family breaks than the latest political developments.

In terms of last month's poll findings, the popularity of Taoiseach Leo Varadkar had continued to increase, to the point where his personal satisfaction rating stood at 59% nationwide. We also saw Mary Lou McDonald enter the leadership satisfaction race at an impressive 46% positivity rating – marginally ahead of Brendan Howlin at 44%, but still someway behind both Leo Varadkar and Micheál Martin as leader of Fianna Fáil.

Fine Gael still held a significant lead over Fianna Fáil in terms of party support, although the former's lead over the latter had been reduced from an 11 point advantage in February to a five point lead in March.

As survey work progressed for this month's poll, the domestic political landscape was undoubtedly dominated by the forthcoming referendum on the potential appeal of the eighth amendment. The pro and anti repeal camps have certainly ramped up their respective campaigns over the last number of weeks, and there is a sense in which the detail of precisely what people will be voting on next month is only now really beginning to crystalise.

Background

From an economic perspective, the country's growth forecasts continue to be revised upwards, improving consumer confidence even further. To counterbalance this economic recovery, however, the housing crisis continues unabated, with the Government under increasing pressure to come up with a coherent plan as to how to reduce housing lists and homelessness.

Party Support and Leader Satisfaction Levels

Satisfaction with the manner in which the Government is running the country has declined, albeit insignificantly, by three percentage points compared to last month's poll, to 47% today. A further 44% are dissatisfied with the Government, with the balance volunteering no opinion on the matter.

Government satisfaction is highest amongst males (54%), those aged 55 years+ (51%), and rural residents (49%).

Conversely, there are more voters dissatisfied than satisfied with the Government amongst females (49% dissatisfied), 35-54 year olds (49% dissatisfied), and C2DE blue collar workers (50% dissatisfied).

Up until today's poll, Leo Varadkar's personal satisfaction rating as Taoiseach had averaged out at 53%. Satisfaction with Varadkar reached a high of 59% just last month, and has dipped this time to its overall average of 53%.

As was the case last month, there are significantly more voters who are happy with the Taoiseach's performance than are unhappy, across all demographic groupings, with 90% of grassroots Fine Gael supporters satisfied with their party boss.

Party Support and Leader Satisfaction Levels

Brendan Howlin will be pleased enough with his satisfaction rating of 45%, representing as it does a four percentage point increase on his standing in April 2017.

The big winners in terms of leader satisfaction this wave are, however, Sinn Féin, whose leader Mary Lou McDonald registers a 51% satisfaction rating – up five points since her first showing in March.

As is the case for Leo Varadkar, there are more voters satisfied with McDonald than are dissatisfied across all demographic groupings, with 84% of Sinn Féin supporters happy in this regard.

With regard to party support, there are no statistically significant shifts between this month and last month's poll. Having said that, with support for Fianna Fáil dropping two percentage points, and Fine Gael support up one percentage point, the gap between the two main parties has again widened, to eight percentage points.

When the figures are interrogated in a little more detail, it emerges that support for Fianna Fáil has in fact increased in rural areas over the last four weeks, with a corresponding drop in Fine Gael rural support.

Support for Fianna Fáil has, however, dropped by eight points in the Dublin area, where Fine Gael remains by far the most popular party, at 42% support.

In line with its party leader support improvement this month, support for Sinn Féin has also increased, by two percentage points, over the last month. The party's standing has improved most significantly amongst female voters, those aged 18-34 years, and urban based citizens.

As noted, none of the shifts in support between March and April are statistically significant, and if the results were replicated in a General Election scenario, the most likely outcome would be a Fine Gael, Labour and smaller party/Independents coalition.

Repeal the Eighth Amendment Referendum

Today's is the third B&A poll in as many months which has measured voting intentions in relation to the forthcoming abortion referendum.

Despite the marked uplift in Referendum campaign activity in general, voting intentions have remained remarkably solid since the beginning of the year.

Thus, just under half of all Irish voters indicate that they will vote yes, to support the proposal to replace the eighth amendment with a clause enabling abortion, with 29% indicating they are likely to vote no.

Once the undecideds are excluded from the equation, we therefore have a circa 60:40 split in favour of repealing the eighth, with greatest opposition to it amongst 55 years+ voters (40% likely to vote no) and indeed Fianna Fáil voters (42% of whom say they will vote against repealing the eighth, compared to 41% who will vote in support of repeal).

There have also been no changes in people's view of legislating to allow abortion without restriction up to 12 weeks of pregnancy. On this question, once the undecideds are excluded, we see yet again that those in favour of abortion up to 12 weeks outweigh those opposed to it, by a margin of circa 55:45.

Based on these poll findings, and given the poll was completed just six weeks in advance of the actual Referendum, it does seem most likely that the Eighth Amendment will be repealed, leaving the matter of subsequent legislation in the hands of the politicians.
