Technical Appendix

Technical Appendix

- The results of this opinion poll are based upon a representative sample of 923 eligible Irish voters aged 18 years +.
- As such, the results can be deemed to be accurate to within plus or minus 3.3 percentage points at the 95% confidence level. Fieldwork was conducted on an in-home, face-to-face basis over the period 29th June – 11th July, 2017.
- The sample was stratified across all constituencies at 125 locations in the country with individuals selected for interview by way of Demographic Quotas (age, gender, socioeconomic status) in line with Central Statistics Office (CSO) and market research industry population estimates.



Technical Appendix

- The subsequent survey results are weighted to reflect the known demographic profile of Irish adults, utilising the most recently published census population estimates from the Central Statistics Office (CSO).
- Party support levels are subsequently realigned in accordance with a technical adjustment factor, designed to smooth the effects of extreme highs and lows in support levels for individual parties as measured at a single point in time, and taking variable election day turnout levels into account.
- All aspects of the survey, including the Party Support adjustment factor, are implemented in accordance with the technical and ethical guidelines set down by the Association of Irish Market Research Organisations (AIMRO) and the European Society of Opinion & Market Research (ESOMAR).

Party Support Adjustment Factor: Technical Note

- Predicting election results on the basis of poll data is not an exact science. All the evidence shows that support for individual parties can swing dramatically in the period between elections- very often outside the bounds of historic election results.
- What to do in these circumstances? Most polling companies in Britain and Ireland publish
 their raw survey results as an index of fluctuations in the emotional mood of voters. They
 also build in an adjustment based on a number of factors. Where we have reports of how
 people voted in the last general election as well as how they intend to vote in the next one
 we can use these data to model the likely level of swing from the last election results.
- We then add back in the forecasts of voters who have not voted last time or do not answer that particular question.
- Finally we take into account each individuals stated likelihood of voting in a forthcoming General Election.
- This is the basis of the adjusted voting forecast in Behaviour & Attitudes polls.






Party Support Levels - Detailed Breakdown Trend (Excluding Undecided - Adjusted)

Commentary

Background

Fieldwork for today's poll was conducted between Thursday 29th June and Tuesday, 11th July, 2017.

As such, this is the first Behaviour & Attitudes/Sunday Times poll conducted since Leo Varadkar was elected leader of Fine Gael and Taoiseach.

In the immediate aftermath of Varadkar's election, all eyes were on what his detractors described as a limited Cabinet re-shuffle, with significant criticism levelled at him over the decision to retain Frances Fitzgerald's role as Tanaiste, and indeed to effectively promote her with the Ministry for Enterprise & Innovation.

The biggest winner in the re-shuffle was undoubtedly Paschal Donohue in his appointment as both Minister for Finance and for Public Expenditure & Reform. From a public opinion perspective however, Eoghan Murphy as the new Minister for Housing has captured most of the ministerial limelight in recent weeks. Much media attention has been paid to Murphy's root and branch review of Simon Coveney's housing strategy, and specifically on his stated focus on identifying effective ways of increasing housing supply, as opposed to focusing moreso on boosting buyers' access to affordable credit.

With regard to Varadkar himself, he faced an early and intense challenge from Fianna Fáil regarding the appointment of Máire Whelan, the former AG, to the Court of Appeal. The newly elected Taoiseach failed to blink however, and Fianna Fáil backed down.



Background

Meanwhile, the Taoiseach has continued to articulate a narrative which suggests that his focus in office will be on championing the cause of a certain type of, presumably middle class, working individual.

The broader political Commentariat meanwhile awaits to see evidence of the substance behind the style of the new Taoiseach.



Party Support and Leader Satisfaction Levels

It is almost invariably the case that the personal satisfaction rating of a new party leader when first measured is higher than the most recent rating for his/her predecessor.

For example, Joan Burton's personal satisfaction rating as leader of the Labour Party was 40% just before she stepped down, with Brendan Howlin's very first personal rating coming in at 43% in July 2016.

Similarly, Leo Varadkar's personal rating as Taoiseach has 'entered the charts' so to speak at 43% - a full six percentage points higher than the 37% rating attributed to Enda Kenny just last month.

The new Taoiseach may be a little disappointed that his rating is still significantly lower than Micheál Martin's at 54%, and is on a par with Gerry Adams at 43%, with both only marginally ahead of Brendan Howlin who attracts a 42% satisfaction score.

It is, however, the case that a full one-third of all Irish voters registered a 'no opinion' response when asked how satisfied they were with Mr. Varadkar as Taoiseach, with just 25% dissatisfied. A significant proportion of the electorate is therefore prepared to wait a while longer until the new Taoiseach has a chance to prove himself, and this in itself is a positive result for Varadkar at this early stage.



Party Support and Leader Satisfaction Levels

Support for Fine Gael in the final three opinion polls of Enda Kenny's stewardship was rock solid at between 28% and 29%.

Fine Gael will, nevertheless be disappointed that in its first B&A opinion poll since the leadership election its party support has remained flat compared to last month's poll, at 29%.

The party therefore remains neck and neck with Fianna Fáil, which is the largest opposition party by quite some margin.

An analysis of the profile of the typical Fine Gael supporter conducted on last month's poll data confirmed that Fine Gael's 29% support amongst all voters skewed most heavily towards males (36%), farmers (49%), the more well heeled ABC1 social class (35%), and those resident in Dublin (32%), and Connaught/Ulster (36%).

In today's poll we see Fine Gael support levelling out in terms of gender, with support for the party amongst males dropping from 36% to 30%, alongside a corresponding uplift in support amongst females from 22% to 28%.

Fine Gael support remains highest amongst the farming community (54%) and the white collar and professional working ABC1 social category (34%). It also remains the largest party in the Dublin area, with 31% support in the capital.

All in all therefore, the early indications are that there has been no impact on Fine Gael support, either in terms of number of potential voters, or indeed the demographic profile of these voters, since the election of its new leader.

Support for Fianna Fáil, meanwhile, continues to consolidate in or around the 30% mark, and it remains the most popular party in the country amongst those aged 55 years+ (up three points to 38% this month) and the blue collar working C2DE socio-economic group (up five percentage points to 35% today).

With regard to the remaining opposition blocs, the results of today's poll are identical to those registered four weeks ago.

In other words, the past couple of months of political shenanigans may well emerge as having been much ado about nothing.

Certainly, we are as clear as we have been since just after last year's election as to the most likely make-up of the next Government – either a combination of Fianna Fáil and Sinn Féin, or a multi-coloured rainbow coalition led by Fine Gael.



Support for Changes to the Constitution

It is expected that the Government will put a number of questions to Irish voters in a Referendum at some stage during 2018. With this in mind, survey respondents were asked whether they would likely vote yes, in support of a number of potential changes to the Constitution, or no, against the changes.

Three specific areas were covered at this question, i.e. the potential removal of blasphemy as a criminal offence from the Constitution, the potential removal of the recognition of a woman's role in the home from the Constitution, and the possible inclusion of the right of Irish emigrants abroad to vote in Irish Presidential elections.

Of the three potential changes to the Constitution, by far the greatest support is for allowing emigrants abroad vote in Irish Presidential elections. Just under seven in ten (69%) of all Irish voters would support such a change, with just one in five opposed to it.

A similarly strong majority is in favour of the Presidential election motion across all socio economic groupings and regions around the country.

The numbers currently in favour of removing blasphemy as a criminal offence from the Constitution out-weigh those opposed to it by a margin of more than 2:1. A quarter are still undecided in this regard.



Support for Changes to the Constitution

Interestingly, opinion is quite evenly divided between those who would vote yes to remove the recognition of a woman's role in the home from the Constitution and those who would vote against removing it.

With 41% currently in favour of such a change and 39% opposed to it, any campaign surrounding the issue will clearly be crucial in swinging any such proposal in either direction.

There are distinct differences in opinion on this matter in terms of age (46% of voters aged 55 years + opposed to the change and 37% in favour of it), and region (with 54% of those in Dublin in favour of the removal, and 44% to 45% of those in Munster and Conn/Ulster opposed to it).
