Technical Appendix

Technical Appendix

- The results of this opinion poll are based upon a representative sample of 926 eligible Irish voters aged 18 years +.
- As such, the results can be deemed to be accurate to within plus or minus 3.3 percentage points at the 95% confidence level. Fieldwork was conducted on an in-home, face-to-face basis over the period 1st to the 13th February, 2018.
- The sample was stratified across all constituencies at 125 locations in the country with individuals selected for interview by way of Demographic Quotas (age, gender, socioeconomic status) in line with Central Statistics Office (CSO) and market research industry population estimates.



Technical Appendix

- The subsequent survey results are weighted to reflect the known demographic profile of Irish adults, utilising the most recently published census population estimates from the Central Statistics Office (CSO).
- Party support levels are subsequently realigned in accordance with a technical adjustment factor, designed to smooth the effects of extreme highs and lows in support levels for individual parties as measured at a single point in time, and taking variable election day turnout levels into account.
- All aspects of the survey, including the Party Support adjustment factor, are implemented in accordance with the technical and ethical guidelines set down by the Association of Irish Market Research Organisations (AIMRO) and the European Society of Opinion & Market Research (ESOMAR).

Party Support Adjustment Factor: Technical Note

- Predicting election results on the basis of poll data is not an exact science. All the evidence shows that support for individual parties can swing dramatically in the period between elections- very often outside the bounds of historic election results.
- What to do in these circumstances? Most polling companies in Britain and Ireland publish their raw survey results as an index of fluctuations in the emotional mood of voters. They also build in an adjustment based on a number of factors. Where we have reports of how people voted in the last general election as well as how they intend to vote in the next one we can use these data to model the likely level of swing from the last election results.
- We then add back in the forecasts of voters who have not voted last time or do not answer that particular question.
- Finally we take into account each individuals stated likelihood of voting in a forthcoming General Election.
- This is the basis of the adjusted voting forecast in Behaviour & Attitudes polls.



Party Support Levels (Excluding Undecided - Adjusted)





Party Support Levels – Detailed Breakdown Trend (Excluding Undecided – Adjusted)






Voting Intentions: Repeal of Eighth Amendment






Attitudes towards legislation to allow abortion without restriction up to 12 weeks of pregnancy






Attitudes towards legislation to allow abortion without restriction up to 12 weeks of pregnancy x Referendum Voting Intentions






Commentary

Background

Fieldwork for today's Behaviour & Attitudes/Sunday Times Poll was conducted over the period Thursday 1st to Tuesday, 13th February.

As such, this is the first poll in the series to be conducted following the resumption of the Dáil after the 2017 Christmas break.

A broad range of political and social developments are likely to have influenced public opinion between this month and last month's poll.

Certainly, the announcement by Taoiseach Leo Varadkar that the Referendum on the appeal of the eighth amendment will be held before the end of May was one of those key developments. For the first time, a Referendum on abortion has become a reality for the Irish electorate, with the forthcoming campaign likely to represent one of the most emotive ones in living memory.

Already the politicians are beginning to set their own stall out in relation to the Referendum, not least Fianna Fáil leader Micheál Martin who shocked many of his own supporters and party colleagues by announcing his support of a repeal.

Three days before the end of survey fieldwork, Gerry Adams passed the mantle of Sinn Féin leader on to Mary Lou McDonald following almost 35 years of his stewardship. This month's poll is therefore the last one in which Gerry Adam's personal satisfaction rating will be measured, and it will be next month's poll before we can gauge the impact on Sinn Féin support levels, if any, of McDonald's ascension to party leader.



Background

In terms of the socio economic landscape, Brexit negotiations, and the potential effect of a hard Brexit on Ireland's economy, continues to be furiously debated.

Meanwhile, fieldwork for the poll coincided with the biggest drop in global stock markets in years – reminding pension holders in particular how vulnerable their retirement funds are to the vagaries of the international markets.

It is also the case that as interviewing for February's survey drew to a close we were fast approaching the second anniversary of the last General Election, held on Friday 26th February 2016.

With the third budget under the Fine Gael/Fianna Fáil confidence and supply arrangement due in just eight months time, the date of the next General Election is looming, whether it actually occurs by end of this year or the beginning of next.



Party Support and Leader Satisfaction Levels

Satisfaction with the manner in which the Government is running the country has increased by four percentage points since last month's poll, with the average Government rating since the election of Leo Varadkar as Taoiseach settling in at 45%. In today's poll, there are more people now satisfied with the Government (48%), than are dissatisfied (43%), with the only sections of the populace registering greater levels of dissatisfaction than satisfaction being blue collar and working class C2DE individuals (50% dissatisfied; 40% satisfied), and those living in Connaught/Ulster (46% dissatisfied, 42% satisfied).

55% of the general public is also satisfied with the performance of Leo Varadkar as Taoiseach, with less than a third unhappy with his performance. These levels of satisfaction with Varadkar's performance in the role are quite consistent across the demographic sub-groupings, and peak amongst the over 55s (62%), ABC1 white collar workers (61%), and the farming community (64%).

At the moment, the Government is riding the crest of a wave, with no sign of an end to the Taoiseach's honeymoon period as he approaches his sixth month in the role.

Satisfaction ratings for Micheál Martin, Brendan Howlin and Gerry Adams remain broadly in line with those recorded over the last couple of months, with half of all voters happy with Martin in his role as main opposition leader, and only 37% dissatisfied with his performance.



Party Support and Leader Satisfaction Levels

Martin's popularity also carries through to support for Fianna Fáil, which remains in line with the 25% to 26% registered for the party since the end of last year. Regionally, however Fianna Fáil will be worried that it has just 17% support in Dublin in this month's poll – a figure which positions the party marginally ahead of Sinn Féin, and behind Independents and smaller parties combined. This is the second poll in a row where Fine Gael support in the capital is around double that of Fianna Fáil, and this is clearly a serious shortcoming which will need to be addressed by Fianna Fáil as a matter of urgency.

Support for Sinn Féin is down marginally in today's poll by two percentage points, and now stands at 16% nationwide. At an average level of support of 17% over the last five months, the party will presumably be hoping for a McDonald bounce in the short to medium term, nudging it closer to 20% support, and a real chance of breaching the 30 seat mark at the next election.

The standout performance this February is, however, Fine Gael's four point increase in support, from 32% in January to 36% now.

Today's performance positions Fine Gael as the most popular party across all ages, all socioeconomic groupings, and all regions around the country. In fact, if the results of today's poll were replicated at the next election, a coalition of Fine Gael, Labour and the likes of the Green Party would be a distinct possibility.



Repeal the Eighth Amendment Referendum

By this stage, we know that the Referendum on the Repeal of the Eighth Amendment to the Constitution will be held before the end of May, that Health Minister Simon Harris is working on the wording of the Referendum, and that this wording will be available to the public for consideration from the beginning of March.

Regardless of how the May Referendum is worded, it seems unlikely that it will include reference to the specific legislation that may be enacted in relation to abortion, in the event of voters deciding to repeal the Eighth.

As such it seems that, even if the politicians indicate that their preferred post-repeal legislation will allow for abortion up to 12 weeks of pregnancy, voters in the May Referendum will have no guarantee that the actual legislation enacted will not introduce an even more liberal abortion regime than that.

In our view, voters will be seeking clear direction over the coming months on the post-appeal legislation that is most likely to be introduced after the May Referendum, and if such clarity is not forthcoming during the campaign, the Referendum may well be lost.

With a view to understanding the current disposition of the Electorate towards the Referendum, respondents in today's poll were first asked whether they would vote to support or oppose the Referendum proposal to replace the Eighth Amendment with a clause enabling abortion.



Repeal the Eighth Amendment Referendum

Having answered this question, respondents were then asked whether they would be in favour of or against legislation to allow abortion without restriction up to 12 weeks of pregnancy.

In response to the first question, which specifically related to the forthcoming Referendum, just under half (49%) of all Irish voters indicated they would vote yes, to support the proposal to replace the Eighth Amendment with a clause enabling abortion, 30% indicated they would vote no, against such a proposal, with the balance undecided.

Those indicating they would vote yes to support such a proposal in the forthcoming Referendum were evenly split across gender, and skewed towards those aged under 54 years of age, living in urban areas, and from a professional and white collar working background.

When respondents were then asked if they would be in favour of or against legislation to allow abortion without restriction up to 12 weeks of pregnancy in the event of the Eighth Amendment being repealed, a different pattern of response emerges.

In response to this specific question around legislating for abortion up to 12 weeks of pregnancy, 43% of all voters indicate they would be in favour of such legislation, 35% are opposed to it, with 22% undecided.

Further analysis of the data indicates that one in five of those who suggested they would vote yes to support the Referendum proposal to replace the Eighth Amendment with a clause enabling abortion are either opposed to the legislation for abortion up to 12 weeks, or are undecided on that point.



Repeal the Eighth Amendment Referendum

The implications of these findings are clear. Public opinion is already quite divided around the issue of introducing abortion up to 12 weeks of pregnancy, with a significant proportion of the population expressing reservations about such legislation.

The real debate over the next few months will therefore be less about whether voters wish to repeal the Eight Amendment or not, and more to do with the precise legislation such a repeal is likely to trigger.
