Technical Appendix

Sample Size

The results of this opinion poll are based upon a representative sample of 935 eligible Irish voters aged 18 years +.



Fieldwork

As such, the results can be deemed to be accurate to within plus or minus 3.3 percentage points at the 95% confidence level. Fieldwork was conducted on an in-home, face-to-face basis over the period 3rd – 15th May, 2018



Location

The sample was stratified across all constituencies at 125 locations in the country with individuals selected for interview by way of Demographic Quotas (age, gender, socio-economic status) in line with Central Statistics Office (CSO) and market research industry population estimates.

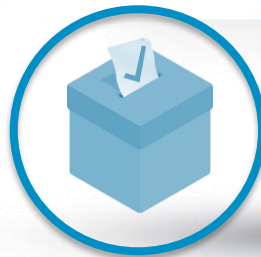
Weighting

The subsequent survey results are weighted to reflect the known demographic profile of Irish adults, utilising the most recently published census population estimates from the Central Statistics Office (CSO).



Party Support

Party support levels are subsequently realigned in accordance with a technical adjustment factor, designed to smooth the effects of extreme highs and lows in support levels for individual parties as measured at a single point in time, and taking variable election day turnout levels into account.



Guidelines

All aspects of the survey, including the Party Support adjustment factor, are implemented in accordance with the technical and ethical guidelines set down by the Association of Irish Market Research Organisations (AIMRO) and the European Society of Opinion & Market Research (ESOMAR).

Party Support Adjustment Factor: Technical Note

- Predicting election results on the basis of poll data is not an exact science. All the evidence shows that support for individual parties can swing dramatically in the period between elections- very often outside the bounds of historic election results.
- What to do in these circumstances? Most polling companies in Britain and Ireland publish their raw survey results as an index of fluctuations in the emotional mood of voters. They also build in an adjustment based on a number of factors. Where we have reports of how people voted in the last general election as well as how they intend to vote in the next one we can use these data to model the likely level of swing from the last election results.
- We then add back in the forecasts of voters who have not voted last time or do not answer that particular question.
- Finally we take into account each individuals stated likelihood of voting in a forthcoming General Election.
- This is the basis of the adjusted voting forecast in Behaviour & Attitudes polls.

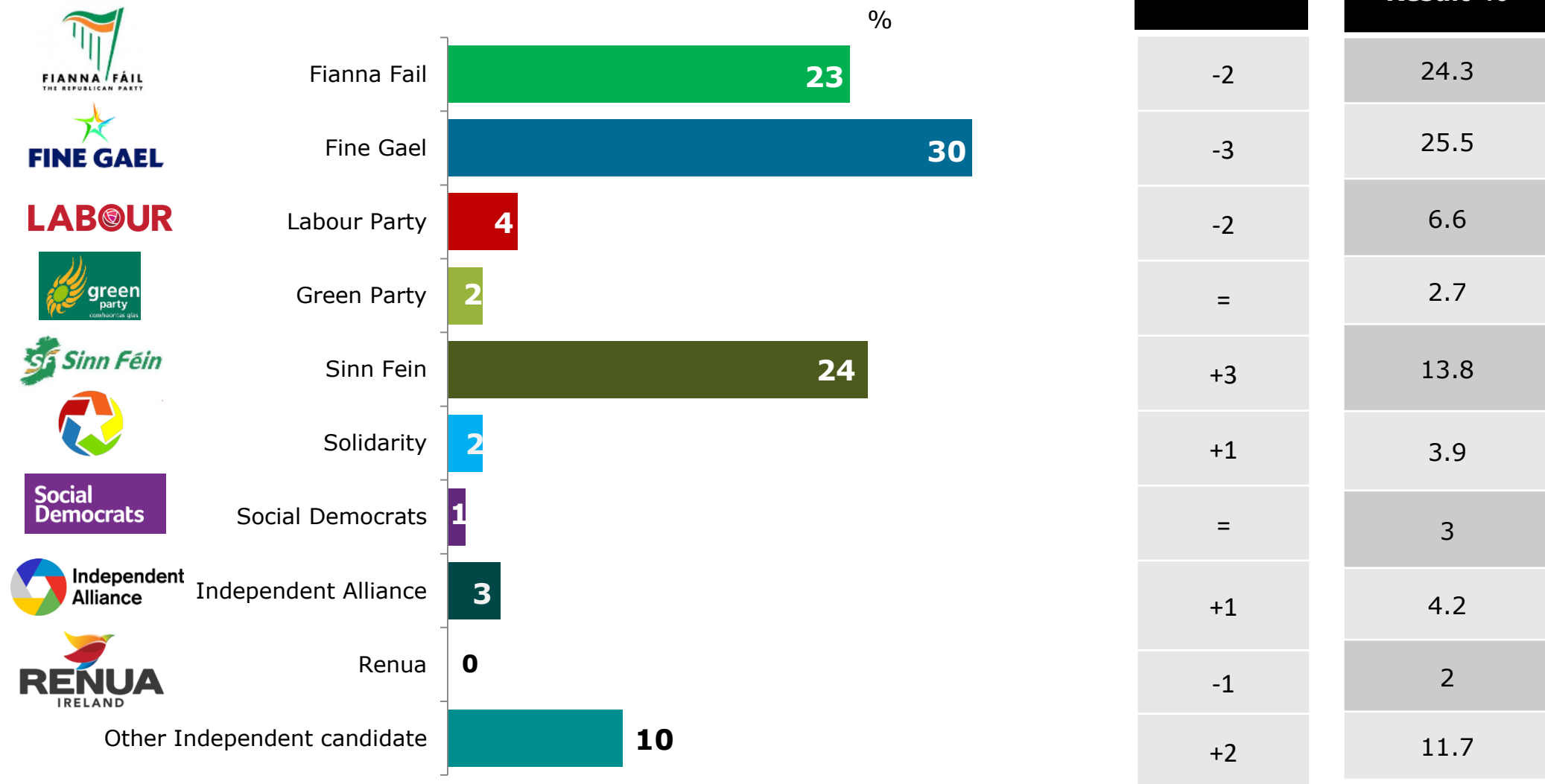

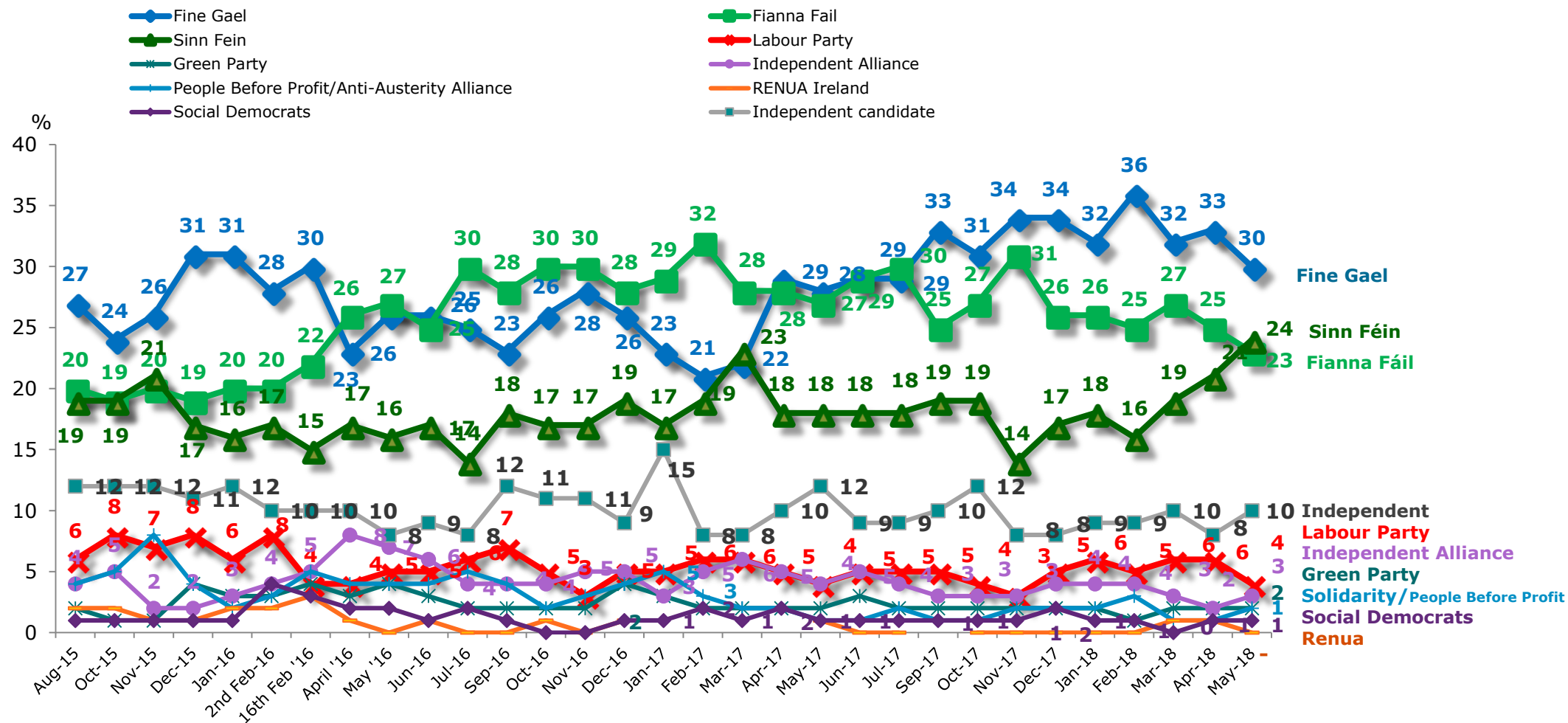

Party Support Levels – Detailed Breakdown (excluding undecided/adjusted)



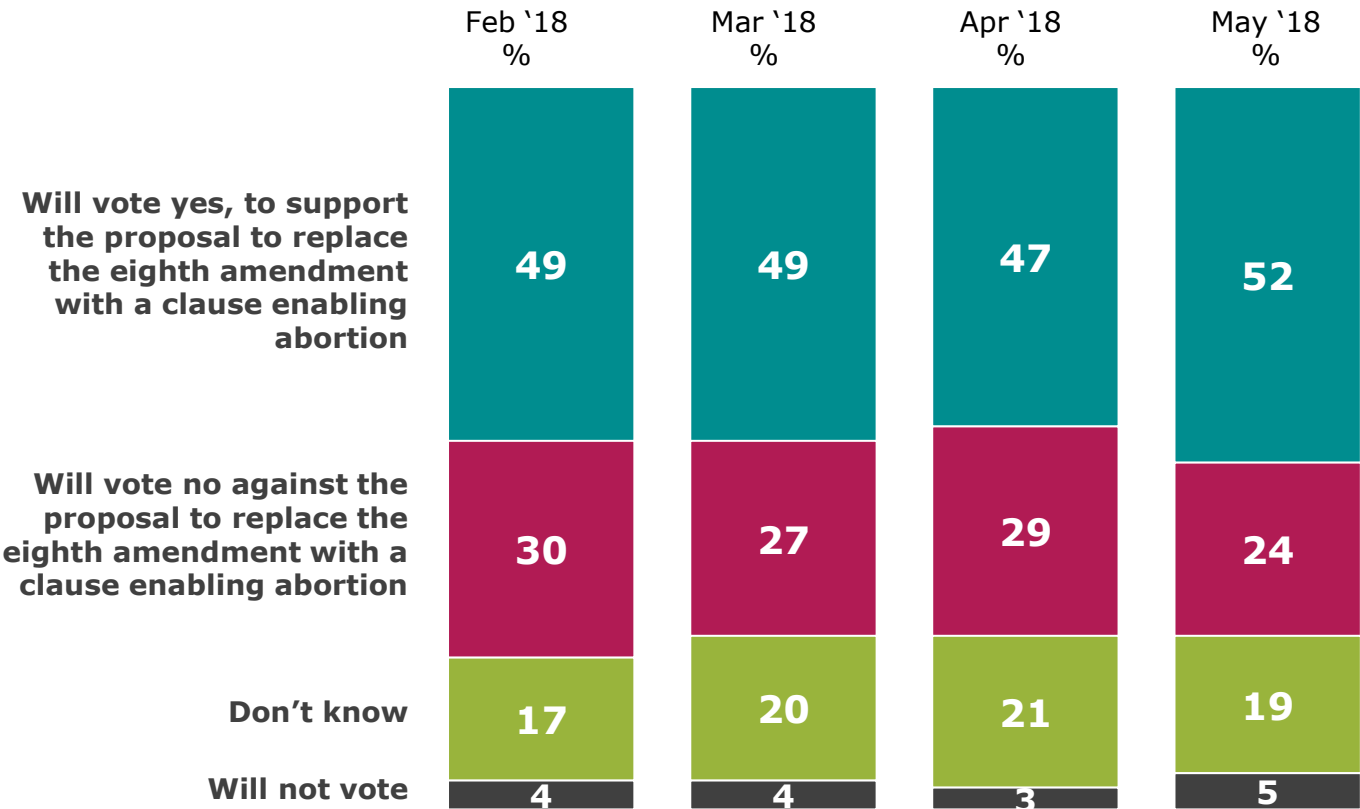
Party Support Levels – Detailed Breakdown Trend (Excluding Undecided – Adjusted)

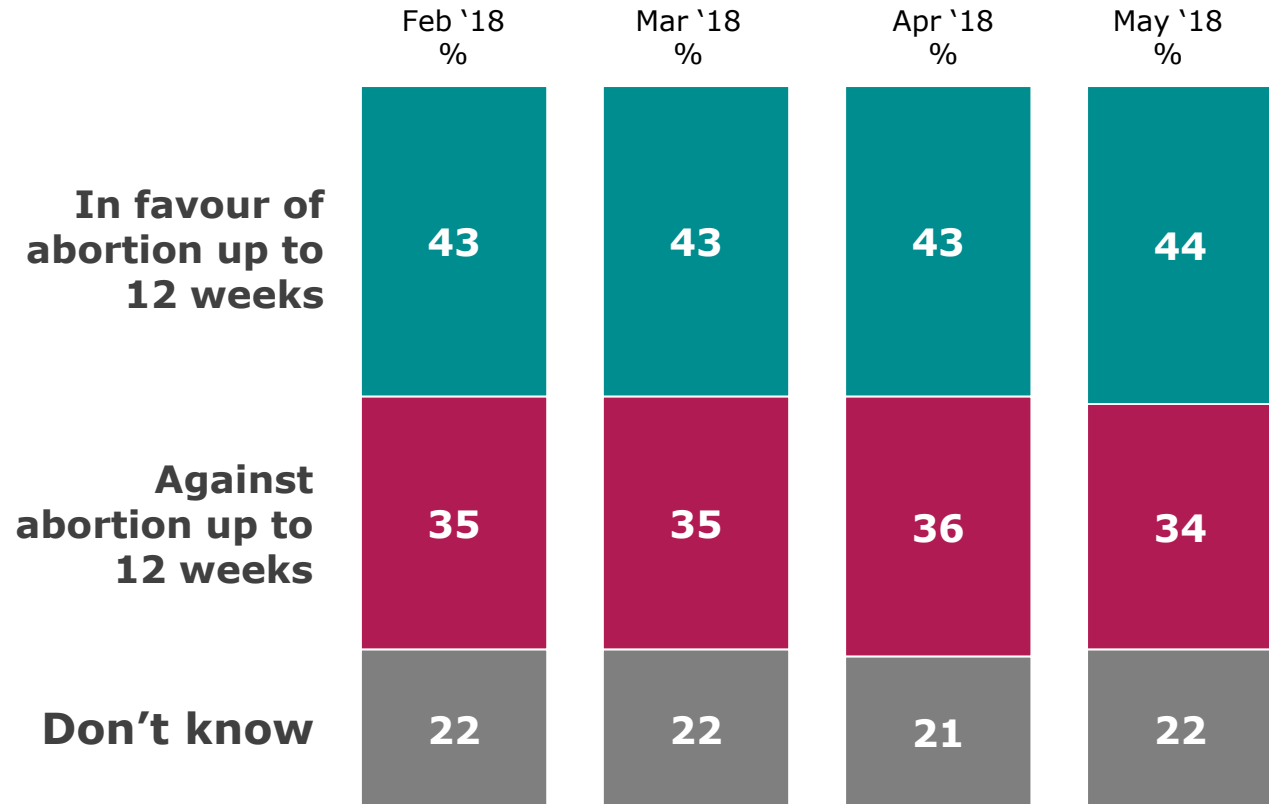

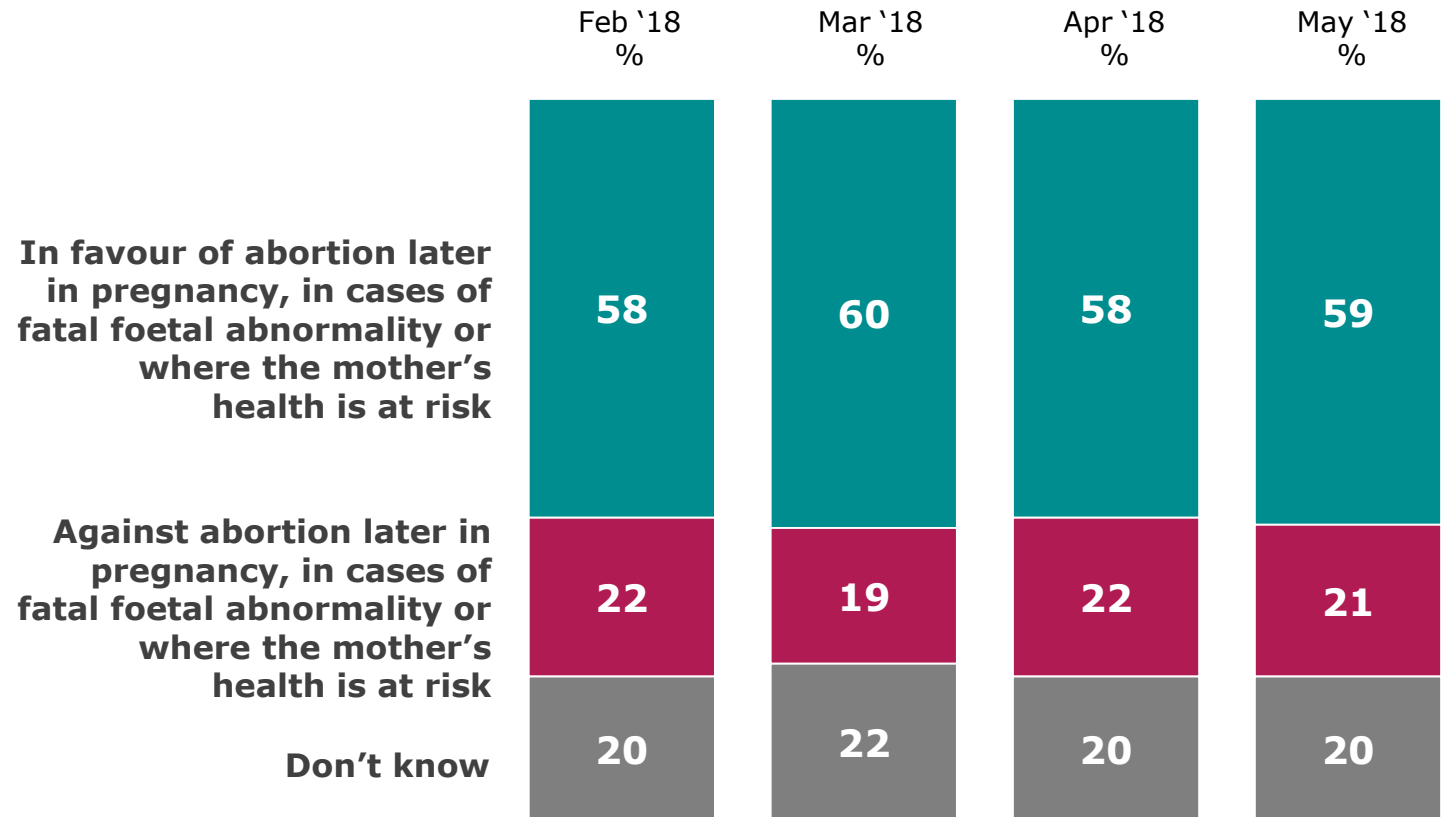
And if the eighth amendment is repealed, would you be in favour of or against legislation to allow abortion without restriction up to 12 weeks of pregnancy?

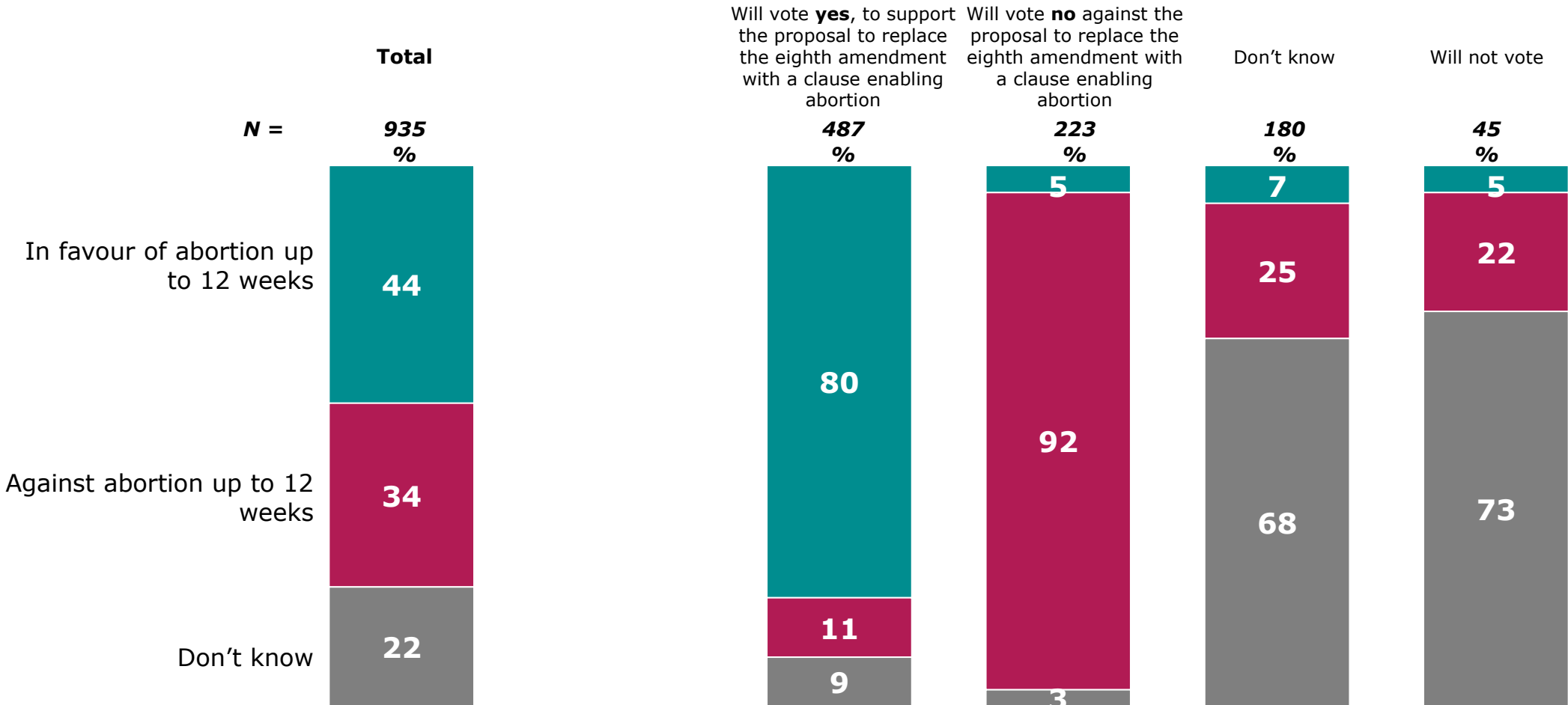


Attitudes towards legislation to allow abortion without restriction up to 12 weeks of pregnancy x Referendum

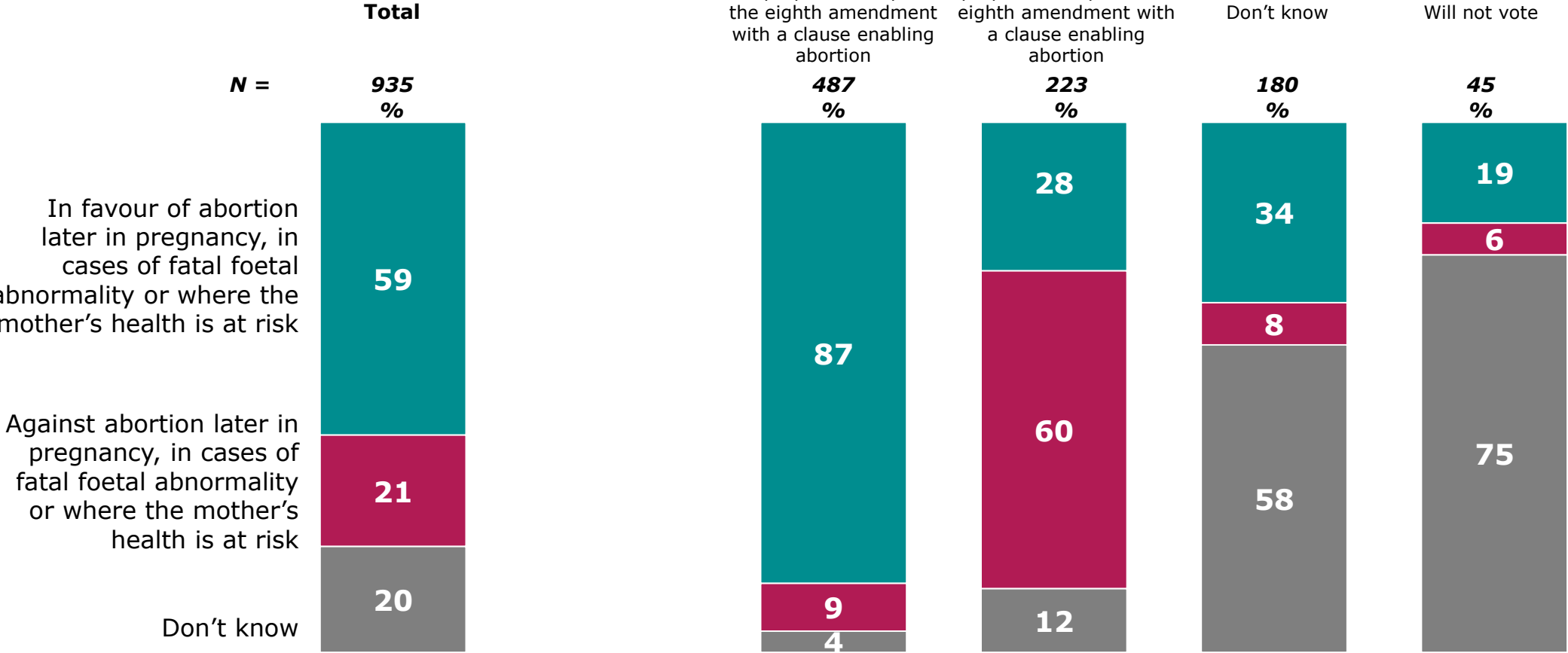

Fieldwork for today's Behaviour & Attitudes/Sunday Times Poll was conducted over the period Thursday, 3rd May – Tuesday, 15th May, 2018.

As such, interviewing coincided with both the Abortion Referendum Yes and No campaigns in full flight, although it would essentially have missed the impact of RTÉ's televised debate on the Referendum on Monday, 1st May.

Certainly, the increasingly emotive nature of the abortion referendum campaigns would have influenced survey respondents' views as measured in today's poll.

Without a doubt, however, the single greatest domestic issue likely to have influenced voter opinion during the course of survey fieldwork was that of the Cervical Smear Test controversy, and the manner in which it was handled by CervicalCheck Ireland, the HSE, and the Government.

The public has watched from the sidelines as the true extent of the controversy has unfolded over the last number of weeks, with most people following coverage of the topic truly aghast at how it has been managed by the authorities.

Meanwhile, the Government remains under constant media scrutiny over the seemingly intractable housing crisis, with some criticism emerging of the manner in which homelessness estimates may be calculated in the future.

Background

Political debate around all of the above issues has been intense over the last couple of weeks in particular, with the Government on the back foot as opposition parties jockey for position in anticipation of a late 2018/early 2019 General Election.

Party Support and Leader Satisfaction Levels

Satisfaction with the manner in which the Government is running the country has dropped significantly over the last four weeks – from 47% of the electorate happy with the Government's performance in April down to just 41% this month.

The most precipitous drops in Government satisfaction are amongst male voters (down 9 points), those aged 55+ years (also down 9 points), white collar and professional working ABC1 individuals (down 8 points), and Dublin residents (down 11 percentage points month-on-month).

The barrage of Government criticism over a range of issues over the last number of weeks has clearly taken its toll, particularly so amongst older, middle class residents of Dublin; that very cohort whose support for Fine Gael has been trending upwards over the last number of years.

Just 12 months ago, Micheál Martin was by far the most popular party leader in the country at 49% satisfaction, followed at some remove by Gerry Adams (38%), Brendan Howlin (38%) and Enda Kenny (34%).

Fast forward 12 months, and with two new leaders in place, the party leader top spot is shared by Leo Varadkar on 53% satisfaction and Mary Lou McDonald on 52%. This is not to say that the satisfaction ratings for either Micheál Martin (at 47%) or Brendan Howlin (at 45%) are not creditable – rather to note the significant impact Mary Lou McDonald has already made on the electorate over quite a short period.

Closer analysis of the data confirms that McDonald's popularity is consistent across all demographic groupings and peaks in the Dublin area where 58% of voters are satisfied with the way in which she is doing her job as leader of Sinn Féin. 27% are dissatisfied, with 15% of those in the capital expressing no opinion on the matter.

In terms of party support levels, this month's poll witnesses a decline in support for Fine Gael (down from 33% to 30%), Fianna Fáil (from 25% last month to 23% today), and the Labour Party which has slipped from 6% support in April to 4% in May.

In line with these levels of decline, support for Sinn Féin and Independents/smaller parties have both increased by 3 percentage points.

Indeed, at 24% support nationwide, Sinn Féin is now the second most popular party in the country, albeit by a margin of just 1 percentage point over Fianna Fáil.

Support for Sinn Féin in the final Behaviour & Attitudes/Sunday Times pre election poll in February 2016 stood at 15%. The party actually captured 14% of the vote in the election just ten days later, returning 23 TDs to the Dáil. If the party was to capture 24% of the vote in the next General Election, it could stand to win 40-45 seats, positioning it as potential kingmaker in post election Government formation negotiations.

Party Support and Leader Satisfaction Levels

Support for Sinn Féin actually reaches 28% amongst all male voters, 28% across all age groups from 18 – 54 years, 32% of C2DE blue collar workers, and 27% across all urban areas in the country.

While support for Independents and smaller parties has increased by three percentage points this month, this is within the context of a terminal decline in support for this bloc since just before the last General Election.

Thus, support for Independents/Others stood at 29% in May 2015, dropped to 25% in May 2016, slid further to 23% in May 2017 and has declined even further over the past twelve months to 18% this May. From a high of 28% of all first preference votes in the 2016 Election, it seems that the next Dáil will see the departure of many Independent and smaller party TDs as significant numbers of voters reject them for the larger parties.

Repeal the Eighth Amendment Referendum

The most remarkable feature of the 2018 Behaviour & Attitudes/Sunday Times Abortion Referendum Polls has been the complete lack of movement in voting intention between February, March and April.

All three of those polls essentially confirmed that just under a quarter of the electorate was undecided as to how they would vote in the Referendum, with the balance split between 60:40 and 65:35 in favour of repeal.

One of these statistics remains consistent in this, the final pre-polling day abortion Referendum Poll in the series. That is, we still have 24% of the electorate who are undecided or will not vote next Friday, 25th May.

There has, however, been a significant shift away from those planning to vote against replacing the Eighth Amendment, and a corresponding increase in those indicating they intend to vote yes to repeal the Eighth.

Indeed, for the first time since February of this year, there is now a small majority (52%) of voters indicating they will vote yes in the Referendum. This increase in support for a yes vote is almost entirely accounted for by urban voters and, specifically, urban voters in Dublin and Leinster.

Repeal the Eighth Amendment Referendum

In last month's poll, we saw that 43% of all rural voters intended to vote yes, 29% were inclined to vote no, while 29% were undecided. This month, the figures amongst rural voters are practically identical – i.e. 42% suggest they will vote yes, 29% that they will vote no, with 29% undecided.

Conversely, just last month 50% of all urban voters indicated they would vote yes, 29% that they would vote no, and 21% that they were undecided.

In today's poll, the urban yes vote has increased to 57%, the no vote has declined to 21%, while undecideds are practically the same at 22%.

The evidence from this data is that there has been a marked swing towards the yes side amongst urban voters over the last three or four weeks, with no shift whatsoever in voting intention amongst the rural electorate.

Even if all of the undecided voters vote no on polling day, the yes side would still prevail.
