Technical Appendix



Sample Size

The results of this opinion poll are based upon a representative sample of 907 eligible Irish voters aged 18 years +.



Fieldwork

As such, the results can be deemed to be accurate to within plus or minus 3.3 percentage points at the 95% confidence level. Fieldwork was conducted on an inhome, face-to-face basis over the period 4th – 15th January, 2019.



Location

The sample was stratified across all constituencies at 125 locations in the country with individuals selected for interview by way of Demographic Quotas (age, gender, socio-economic status) in line with Central Statistics Office (CSO) and market research industry population estimates.





Technical Appendix



Weighting

The subsequent survey results are weighted to reflect the known demographic profile of Irish adults, utilising the most recently published census population estimates from the Central Statistics Office (CSO).



Party Support

Party support levels are subsequently realigned in accordance with a technical adjustment factor, designed to smooth the effects of extreme highs and lows in support levels for individual parties as measured at a single point in time, and taking variable election day turnout levels into account.



Guidelines

All aspects of the survey, including the Party Support adjustment factor, are implemented in accordance with the technical and ethical guidelines set down by the Association of Irish Market Research Organisations (AIMRO) and the European Society of Opinion & Market Research (ESOMAR).

Party Support Adjustment Factor: Technical Note

- Predicting election results on the basis of poll data is not an exact science. All the evidence shows that support for individual parties can swing dramatically in the period between elections- very often outside the bounds of historic election results.
- What to do in these circumstances? Most polling companies in Britain and Ireland publish their raw survey results as an index of fluctuations in the emotional mood of voters. They also build in an adjustment based on a number of factors. Where we have reports of how people voted in the last general election as well as how they intend to vote in the next one we can use these data to model the likely level of swing from the last election results.
- We then add back in the forecasts of voters who have not voted last time or do not answer that particular question.
- Finally we take into account each individuals stated likelihood of voting in a forthcoming General Election.
- This is the basis of the adjusted voting forecast in Behaviour & Attitudes polls.



Party Support Levels - Detailed Breakdown





Party Support Levels - Detailed Breakdown Trend



Background

Fieldwork for today's poll was conducted over the period Friday 4th to Tuesday 15th January, 2019.

As such, interviewing for the survey ended on the day that the Dáil resumed after the Christmas break, a period when voters usually disengage from the electoral process to spend time with friends and family.

This year in particular, however, the public had much to consider over the holiday period regarding political and economic issues.

For example, fieldwork for the poll coincided with the longest Government shutdown in US history. Coupled with the on-going US trade war with China, signs are already emerging that the US economy is beginning to slow down, with all of the associated risks this would pose for the Global economy.

Much closer to home, the Brexit situation has spiralled out of control, with greater uncertainty than ever before as to its likely impact on the Irish border, and the Irish economy in general.

Against this broad backdrop, a growing number of gloomy stories have been appearing in the business pages to the effect that we are heading towards a global recession within the next year or two.

Locally, meanwhile, the housing crisis continues unabated, with the overrun on the National Children's Hospital budget now likely to lead to cuts in other areas of the healthcare service.

All in all, therefore, it has not been the most positive of starts to 2019, and all eyes will be on the body politic over the coming weeks and months to see how well these challenges are managed.



Party Support and Leader Satisfaction Levels

Citizens typically disengage from politics over holiday periods, as the Dáil goes into recess, and quality time is spent with friends and family.

One of the effects of this dynamic tends to be a drop in Government and Party leader satisfaction ratings in the first poll following such breaks – a function of all things political having fallen off people's radar for a prolonged period.

For example, Government satisfaction dropped seven percentage points between December 2017 and January 2018, following the Christmas break. A similar pattern emerges this January, albeit to a significantly greater extent than is usual.

This year, Government satisfaction has again dropped seven points from December (41%), to just 34% today, the lowest level of Government satisfaction since April 2017. Practically all of this drop in satisfaction has switched into dissatisfaction with the Government. Thus, the proportion of all voters unhappy with the manner in which the Government is running the country has increased from 51% in December to 58% this month, with a majority of voters across practically all social demographic groupings now unhappy with the administration.

Meanwhile, satisfaction with Micheál Martin as leader of Fianna Fáil has declined from 50% to 42% month-on-month, with one in five of all core Fianna Fáil voters now dissatisfied with their leader's performance.

An even more significant dip in satisfaction is registered for Leo Varadkar. As of this month, 38% of all Irish voters are satisfied with the way Mr. Varadkar is doing his job as Taoiseach, compared to 48% just four weeks ago. Furthermore, we now have a majority, albeit at 52% a small one, of all voters who are dissatisfied with the Taoiseach – a figure which rises to 56% of those aged 55 years+, 58% of all C2DE working class individuals, and 57% of rural dwellers.

Mary Lou McDonald's personal satisfaction rating has dipped from 44% to 40%, although she is now, along with Micheál Martin, one of the most popular leaders in the country. Brendan Howlin's satisfaction as leader of the Labour Party remains solid, at 38% this month versus 39% in December.

Compared to party leader and Government satisfaction levels, support for the various political parties and groupings is more stable. The most significant drop in support is registered for Fianna Fáil, whose potential share of the vote has dropped from 29% to 26% poll-on-poll. Nevertheless, today's showing for Fianna Fáil matches its previous six month average of 26% support, indicating that the party has consistently been attracting the potential vote of a quarter of the electorate nationwide.

The most pronounced drop in Fianna Fáil support has been amongst female voters (from 31% to 24%), 18 to 34 year olds (from 27% to 19%), and individuals in the Greater Dublin Area (from 28% to 19%).

Fine Gael, on 30% support, has managed to re-open the gap between itself and Fianna Fáil, although at four percentage points, the difference between the two parties lies just outside the statistical margin of error. Crucially, support for Fine Gael remains at 35% in Dublin – more than twice the support for Fianna Fáil in the capital.

Sinn Féin support has increased three points this month – from 17% in December to 20% today. This positions the party very much in line with its combined six month average support level of 20%, and it will be pleased to have recovered some of the ground it lost between last November and December. Almost 80% of Sinn Féin's support emanates from urban areas around the country, especially in Dublin where its level of support currently stands at 24%.

Support for the Labour Party has drifted back down from a high of 6% last October/November to just 4% today, although this figure does rise to 7% in the Greater Dublin Area.

Finally, support for Independents and smaller parties has increased for the second month in a row – from 15% in November, to 18% in December, and 20% today. Of note in this regard is the three point increase in support for non-aligned Independent candidates this month, from 10% to 13% overall.

The proportion of those indicating they are considering voting for non-aligned independents in the next election varies quite considerably across different voter groupings. For example, support for such candidates currently stands at 24% in rural areas, 22% amongst the farming community, 17% of all ABC1 white collar and professional working individuals, and 15% amongst both females and those aged 35-54 years.

While based on one opinion poll in isolation, there is a message in today's survey. We have witnessed a combined drop of five percentage points in support for the 'establishment' Fine Gael/Fianna Fáil/Labour parties, and a corresponding uplift of six percentage points in support for Sinn Féin and unaligned Independents combined.

Coupled with the drops in Government and main party leader satisfaction, there are some indications that the electorate is becoming unsettled at the volatile political climate, and are perhaps beginning to doubt the current administration's ability to lead the country to safer ground.



Divorce Waiting Time

The Government has decided that a referendum to ease the constitutional restrictions on divorce is to be held on the same day as the local and European elections in late May.

At present, the Constitution only permits divorce where certain conditions are met, including that the spouses have lived apart for four of the previous five years. Now the Government proposes to reduce the four year requirement to two years.

With this in mind, a question was included in today's poll, the intention of which was to gauge voters' views of the existing divorce waiting time, and how it might be altered.

At an overall level, our poll reveals that 80% of the electorate believes the current waiting time should be reduced, with just one in ten of the view that the waiting time for a divorce in Ireland should remain as it is.

The 80% desiring a reduction in the waiting time splits out evenly into three groupings; 26% who believe there should be no waiting time at all for a divorce in Ireland, 27% who believe the waiting time should be reduced from four years to one year, and 27% who would like to see the waiting time reduced to two years. 9% of all respondents are undecided on the issue.



Divorce Waiting Time

Those who believe the four year waiting time should be retained are skewed towards older respondents and those from the farming community, although even within these groupings the vast majority wish to see the four year wait reduced. As might be expected, younger voters aged 18 to 34 years are most likely of all to suggest there should be no waiting time for a divorce at all.

Support for retention of the existing four year waiting time is highest amongst Fianna Fáil voters at 18%, while a desire for any waiting time at all to be scrapped peaks amongst Labour Party, Green Party and Sinn Féin voters.

All in all, therefore, there seems to be no doubt that the forthcoming Referendum will result in an easing of current divorce waiting times.
