Sample Size

The results of this opinion poll are based upon a representative sample of 934 eligible Irish voters aged 18 years+.



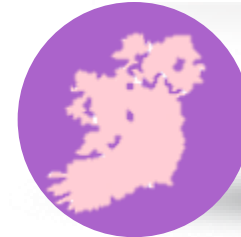
Fieldwork

As such, the results can be deemed to be accurate to within plus or minus 3.3 percentage points at the 95% confidence level. Fieldwork was conducted on an in-home, face-to-face basis over the period Thursday, 5th – Tuesday, 17th December, 2019.



Location

The sample was stratified across all constituencies at 125 locations in the country with individuals selected for interview by way of Demographic Quotas (age, gender, socio-economic status) in line with Central Statistics Office (CSO) and market research industry population estimates.

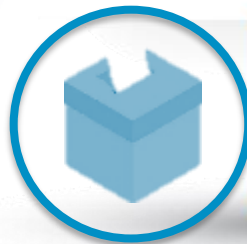
Weighting

The subsequent survey results are weighted to reflect the known demographic profile of Irish adults, utilising the most recently published census population estimates from the Central Statistics Office (CSO).



Party Support

Party support levels are subsequently realigned in accordance with a technical adjustment factor, designed to smooth the effects of extreme highs and lows in support levels for individual parties as measured at a single point in time, and taking variable election day turnout levels into account.



Guidelines

All aspects of the survey, including the Party Support adjustment factor, are implemented in accordance with the technical and ethical guidelines set down by the Association of Irish Market Research Organisations (AIMRO) and the European Society of Opinion & Market Research (ESOMAR).

Party Support Adjustment Factor: Technical Note

- Predicting election results on the basis of poll data is not an exact science. All the evidence shows that support for individual parties can swing dramatically in the period between elections- very often outside the bounds of historic election results.
- What to do in these circumstances? Most polling companies in Britain and Ireland publish their raw survey results as an index of fluctuations in the emotional mood of voters. They also build in an adjustment based on a number of factors. Where we have reports of how people voted in the last general election as well as how they intend to vote in the next one we can use these data to model the likely level of swing from the last election results.
- We then add back in the forecasts of voters who have not voted last time or do not answer that particular question.
- Finally we take into account each individuals stated likelihood of voting in a forthcoming General Election.
- This is the basis of the adjusted voting forecast in Behaviour & Attitudes polls.

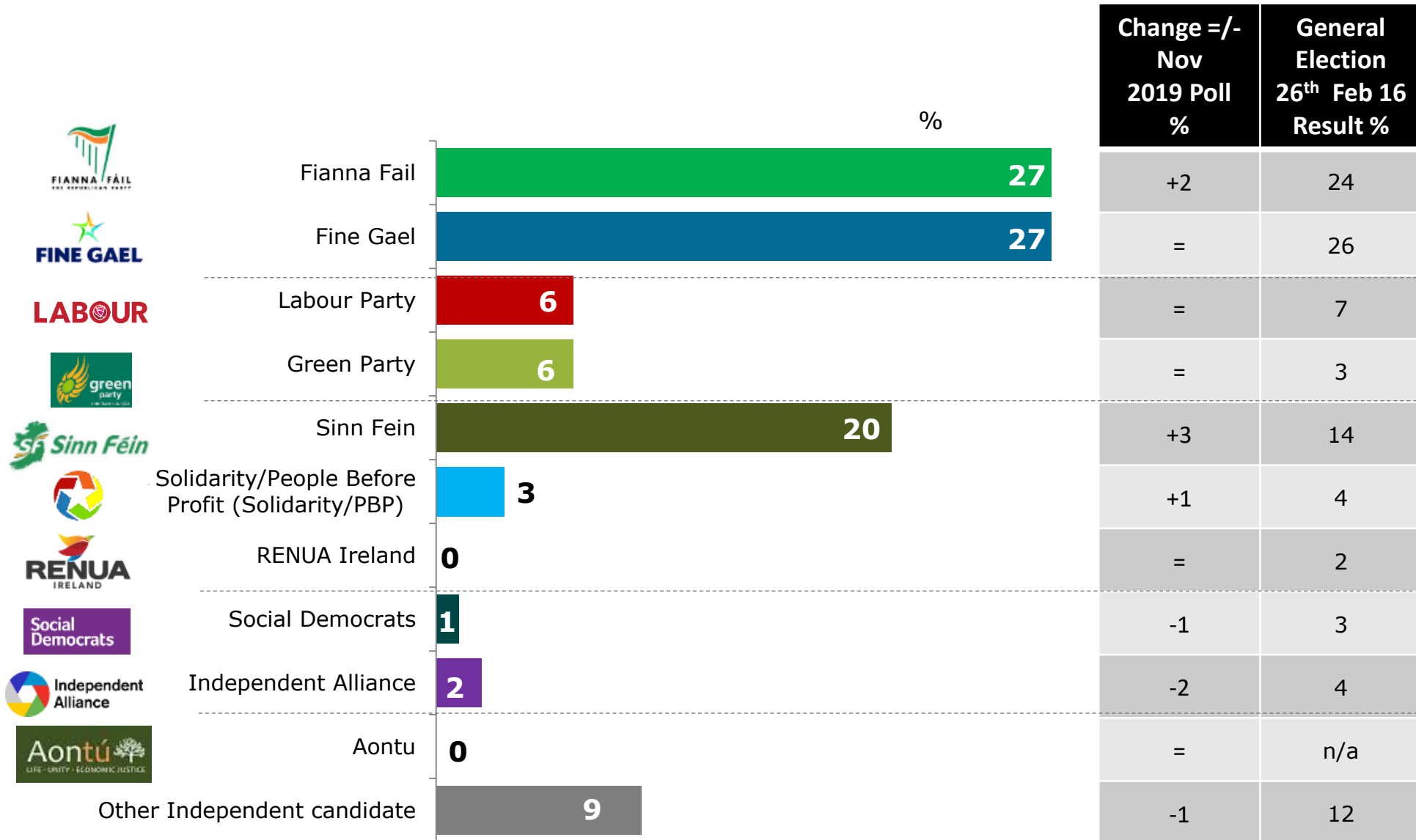

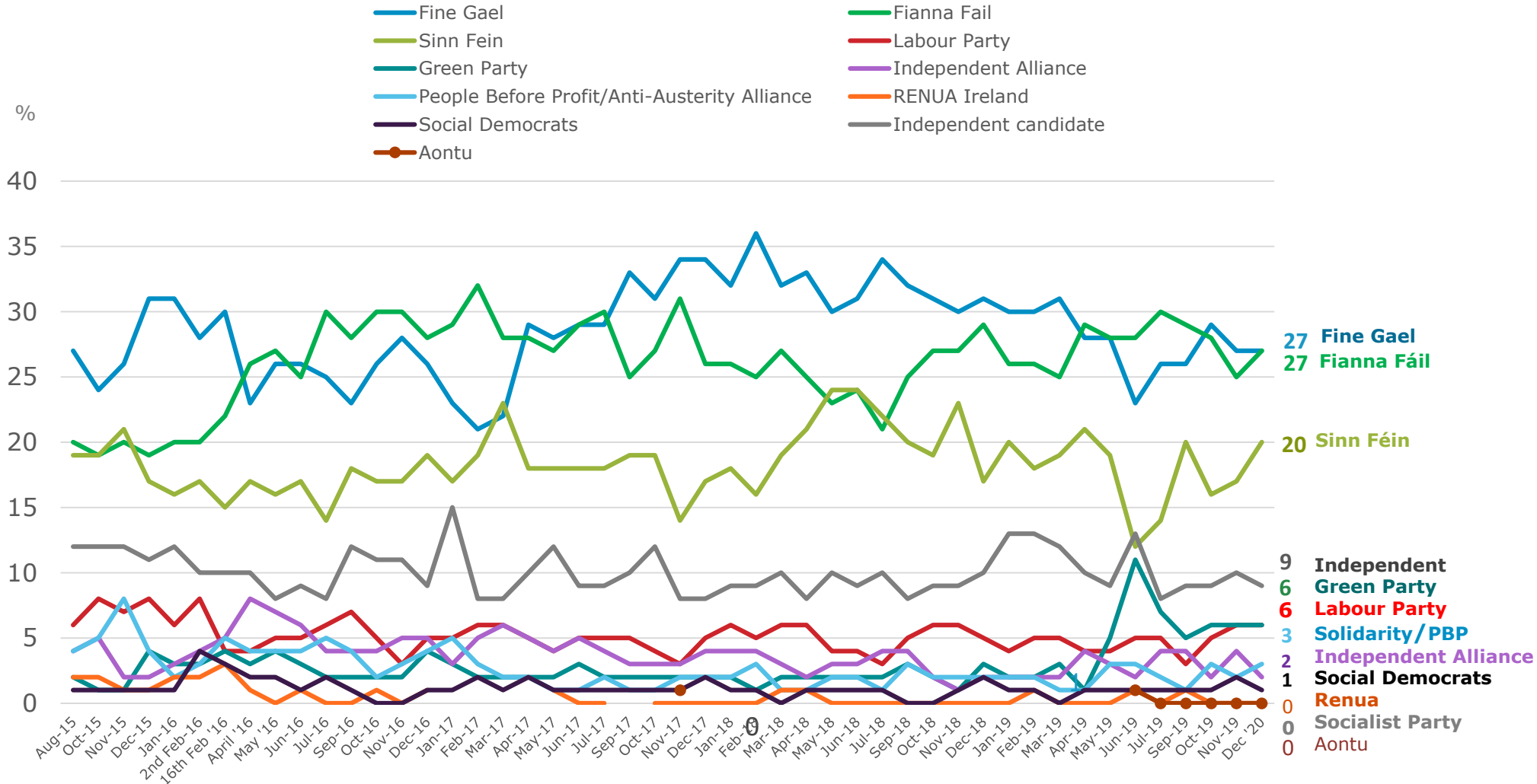
Party Support Levels - Detailed Breakdown

Commentary

Background

Last month's poll witnessed a three percentage point decline in support for Fianna Fáil in the aftermath of Button-Gate in the Dáil, and 'Tweet-Gate' courtesy of Fianna Fáil senator Lorraine Clifford-Lee. This dip in support represented a reverse of the lead Fianna Fáil had enjoyed over Fine Gael throughout the summer months. In addition, with voters' attention drifting away from Brexit by the beginning of November, voters had switched their focus more closely on domestic politics, with a resultant decline in support for Fine Gael from 29% in October to 27% in November.

Fieldwork for December's poll was conducted over the period Thursday 5th to Tuesday 17th December. Political events which will have impacted voters' opinions in the lead up to the poll include the by-elections in Wexford, Cork North Central, Fingal and Dublin Mid West on November 29th, and the UK General Election on the 12th December.

While common wisdom has always maintained that the results of by-elections cannot be extrapolated to General Elections for a range of valid reasons, a number of trends from the elections held at the end of last month cannot be ignored.

First, with a combined share of the vote across all four constituencies of 24% (compared to 20% for Fine Gael), enough to win two of the four seats, Fianna Fáil has confirmed that, with the right candidates, it is well placed to out-poll Fine Gael at the next General Election. Such a result would be in keeping with most polls in the Behaviour & Attitudes/ Sunday Times series since April of this year, whereby Fianna Fáil has either out-performed or matched Fine Gael in the popularity stakes.

Background

Second, the Green Party's performance in the Fingal constituency where it captured 23% of the vote and a seat for Joe O'Brien, consolidates that party's resurgence, as first evidenced in May's Local and European elections.

Third, the Labour Party's share of the vote across all four by-election constituencies was 14%. Again, this result follows on from a respectable performance by that party in the Local and European Elections, and suggests it may be poised for something of a comeback in the General Election.

Finally, the by-elections represented something of a do or die moment for Sinn Féin after its disastrous performance in the Local and European Elections. Apart from winning the seat in Dublin Mid West, Sinn Féin's combined share of the vote across the four constituencies of 14% is very much in line with its 2016 General Election performance. Combined with its strong performance in the recent Westminster Election, and the likely restoration of the Stormont Assembly soon, that party is well positioned to optimise its potential vote in next year's Dáil election.

Party Support and Leader Satisfaction Levels

Both Taoiseach Leo Varadkar and the leader of Fianna Fáil, Micheál Martin have acknowledged in recent weeks that the current Government has run its course, and will have drawn to a natural end by the early part of next year.

Based on the results of today's poll, it seems that the General Public agrees with them on this matter, with almost twice as many voters dissatisfied with the manner in which the country is being run as are satisfied. Indeed, Government satisfaction has declined from 51% in December 2017, to 41% in December 2018, and just 33% this December. The only party whose supporters are generally satisfied with the Government is Fine Gael, and even amongst its core voter base the proportions actively unhappy with the administration have increased from 18% four weeks ago to 21% today.

Sections of the population that are particularly dissatisfied with the Government include female voters (61% dissatisfied), 35 to 54 year old family stage voters (63%), blue collar working C2DE voters (64%), and those living in rural areas (64% dissatisfied).

In keeping with this shift in sentiment away from the Government, Leo Varadkar's personal satisfaction rating has also dropped significantly this month – from 43% in November to 38% today. The most significant month-on-month declines in satisfaction with Varadkar are amongst females (down ten points), the farming community (down 15 points), and rural dwellers (down 9 points).

Micheál Martin and Mary Lou McDonald's personal satisfaction ratings have both edged up marginally, while Brendan Howlin's has slipped back by a statistically insignificant three percentage points.

With regard to party support, the see-sawing between Fianna Fáil and Fine Gael for pole position continues, with the two parties yet again locked in a dead heat.

At 27% support each, the two main establishment parties continue to command a majority share of the national vote, the only question being which of them leads the next administration.

In a straight head-to-head between the two main parties, it is worth noting that Fine Gael support is significantly greater than Fianna Fáil's amongst female voters, with Fianna Fáil holding the advantage amongst males.

Fianna Fáil is currently more popular among voters aged 55 years plus, with Fine Gael performing significantly better than Fianna Fáil amongst the under 35s. Fine Gael does hold a distinct advantage in Dublin (33%) over Fianna Fáil (19%), although Fianna Fáil captures a significantly greater share of the rural vote (37%) than does Fine Gael (26%).

One clear message from this analysis is that Fianna Fáil is beginning to gain a significant edge over Fine Gael amongst those very cohorts of the populace (i.e. older voters and rural Ireland dwellers) who feel their needs have been ignored by the Government over the last number of years.

To some extent, the Labour Party and the Green Party are fishing amongst the same pool of voters, insofar as support for both parties peaks in large towns and cities (at 7% support each), and within the broader Dublin and Leinster region (where both parties command 8% support).

Within these regions, however, significant differences emerge between the supporters of these two minority parties. Thus, support for the Green Party increases amongst younger voters, with Labour Party support highest amongst older individuals. Support for the Greens is also highest amongst ABC1 professional and white collar workers, with Labour support peaking amongst the blue collar and social welfare recipient C2DE grouping.

Of all of the political parties, support for Sinn Féin has been the most volatile since the beginning of the year, beginning with 20% support in January, dropping to just 12% in June and 14% in July, and back up to 20% again this December.

Undoubtedly buoyed by its recent victories in the Dublin Mid West by-election and Northern Westminster Election, that party's greatest challenge continues to lie in the concentration of its vote amongst younger voters, who of course are significantly less likely than their older counterparts to turn out and vote on election day.

Apart from this generational dynamic, Sinn Féin will note that it performs particularly well in this month's poll in urban areas across the country where, at 23% support, the party is one point ahead of Fianna Fáil, and just five percentage points behind Fine Gael.

Finally, the fate of smaller entities such as Solidarity/People Before Profit will be decided upon on a constituency by constituency basis with, for example, support for that grouping reaching 7% in Dublin – essentially on a par with both the Labour Party and the Green Party in the capital.
